## STATEMENT FROM DOI COMMISSIONER MARK G. PETERS

DOI Commissioner Mark G. Peters said, "Earlier today, the New York City Department of Investigation (DOI) sent a request to the New York State Office of Children and Family Services for access to records from the New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS) regarding Jaden Jordan, the three-year old who suffered life-threatening injuries earlier this week. Since the release in May 2016 of DOI's report that focused on ACS's investigatory and foster care oversight failures, DOI has continued to request numerous ACS records on specific child protective investigations and foster care oversight. As the Inspector General for ACS, DOI independently reviews child fatalities/near fatalities of ACS-involved children. DOI has been actively investigating whether some or all of these cases were lawfully handled by ACS, whether there continue to be systemic and preventable problems at ACS that place children in danger, and whether ACS has implemented necessary changes noted in DOI's prior reviews. DOI's historical work in this area gives us a broad and informed foundation from which to conduct this ongoing investigation. DOI will issue a public report at its conclusion."

DOI is one of the oldest law-enforcement agencies in the country and New York City's corruption watchdog. Investigations may involve any agency, officer, elected official or employee of the City, as well as those who do business with or receive benefits from the City. DOI's strategy attacks corruption comprehensively through systemic investigations that lead to high-impact arrests, preventive internal controls and operational reforms that improve the way the City runs.
