PROCEEDINGS

MS. LIGUORI: Good morning and welcome. My name is Madelynn Liguori. I am the Director of Regulatory Compliance & Enforcement and Executive Agency Counsel for the Department of Sanitation. Thank you for attending this public hearing this morning.

DSNY is conducting this remote hearing in accordance with the requirements of the City Administrative Procedure Act. The purpose of this hearing is to receive comments from the public on DSNY's proposed rule relating to notice and hearing requirements for abandoned vehicles.

This rule was published by DSNY in The City Record on December 16, 2025, with a scheduled hearing date of today, January 15, 2026. Additionally, DSNY emailed copies of the rule to all New York City local-elected officials, the City's 59 community boards, media and interested parties, and published the proposed rule on its website.

1           The New York City Department of  
2           Sanitation is responsible for the  
3           removal of certain abandoned vehicles  
4           within New York City. An abandoned  
5           vehicle, as described in Section 1224(2)  
6           of the New York State Vehicle and  
7           Traffic Law, includes vehicles parked on  
8           the street without license plates for  
9           more than six hours.

10           This proposed rule would set forth  
11           notice requirements to ensure that  
12           registered owners and other  
13           ascertainable interested parties,  
14           including any lienholders or other  
15           persons with a legal claim or security  
16           interest in an abandoned vehicle, are  
17           notified and provided an opportunity to  
18           claim the vehicle before the abandoned  
19           vehicle is dismantled, destroyed, or  
20           disposed of.

21           This proposed rule would also  
22           establish procedures for an interested  
23           party to challenge the removal of an  
24           abandoned vehicle by DSNY or the fees  
25           imposed for towing and storage of an

1 abandoned vehicle.

2 Specifically, this proposed rule  
3 would:

4 One, establish a notice process by  
5 which DSNY would send ascertainable  
6 owners and interested parties, by  
7 certified mail, return receipt  
8 requested, or by email, if authorized, a  
9 notice containing the following  
10 information:

11 A brief description of the abandoned  
12 vehicle; the date of such vehicle's  
13 removal; instructions on how to redeem  
14 such vehicle; all applicable towing and  
15 storage fees; instructions on how to  
16 request a hearing to challenge the  
17 removal of the vehicle and/or the  
18 imposition of towing and storage fees;  
19 examples of documents to demonstrate  
20 that the interested party is entitled to  
21 redeem such vehicle; and a statement of  
22 DSNY's right to have such vehicle  
23 dismantled, destroyed, or otherwise  
24 disposed of, unless within 10 calendar  
25 days after the date on which such notice

1 is sent, an interested party presents  
2 proof to the Department establishing  
3 lawful entitlement to possession of such  
4 vehicle and pays all applicable fees or  
5 requests a hearing.

6 Two, provide an owner or interested  
7 party with an opportunity, within 10  
8 calendar days from the date of the  
9 notice, to either redeem an abandoned  
10 vehicle or to challenge the removal of  
11 such vehicle and/or the imposition of  
12 any fees imposed.

13 Three, describe the procedure by  
14 which an abandoned vehicle can be  
15 redeemed.

16 Four, set forth the procedure to  
17 challenge the removal of an abandoned  
18 vehicle or the fees imposed, which would  
19 include a virtual hearing scheduled  
20 within 72 hours of a hearing request,  
21 subject to modification based on a  
22 request for a reasonable accommodation.  
23 A decision would be rendered within five  
24 business days and would constitute a  
25 final agency determination.

1           Five, state the applicable towing  
2           and storage fees based on the weight of  
3           a vehicle.

4           This proposed rule would ensure that  
5           all interested parties receive notice  
6           and an opportunity to be heard prior to  
7           an abandoned vehicle being dismantled,  
8           destroyed, or disposed of by DSNY.

9           A court reporter is present today  
10          and will record the hearing. You may  
11          present an oral statement or submit  
12          written comments concerning the proposed  
13          rule. We have been accepting written  
14          comments on the proposed rule since it  
15          was published. Today is the deadline  
16          for submission of written comments.

17          Such comments may be emailed  
18          directly to [nycrules@dsny.nyc.gov](mailto:nycrules@dsny.nyc.gov) by 5  
19          p.m. today.

20          DSNY will make available a copy of  
21          all written comments received through  
22          today, together with the hearing  
23          transcript, for viewing on its website  
24          within the next few weeks. DSNY will  
25          carefully consider all comments it

1 receives today at the hearing and all  
2 written comments it receives.

3 I will begin calling those of you  
4 who wish to speak this morning in the  
5 order in which you have signed up to  
6 testify. While the notice asked that  
7 persons wishing to testify sign-up in  
8 advance of this hearing, anyone wishing  
9 to testify at this time may do so by  
10 indicating in the chat area that you  
11 wish to testify by indicating your name  
12 and affiliation, if any.

13 When you speak, please say your name  
14 and affiliation, and speak slowly and  
15 clearly so that the court reporter can  
16 understand and accurately record your  
17 statement. We also ask that you limit  
18 your statement to three minutes.

19 As of right now, no one has signed  
20 up to testify. We will keep the record  
21 open in case anyone joins and we will  
22 ask if they would like to testify.

23 (Record remained open.)

24 MS. LIGUORI: Hi. For those that  
25 just joined, the floor is open. If you

1           would like to testify, you can please --  
2           you either indicate so in the chat or  
3           use the "raise hand" function.

4           Hi, Counsel Member Brewer. How are  
5           you?

6           MS. BREWER: I'm well. I don't know  
7           -- can you hear you?

8           MS. LIGUORI: We can hear you.  
9           Would you like to testify?

10          MS. BREWER: It's more a question.

11          I can testify and basically have  
12          been doing this constituent work for a  
13          very long time and I have three  
14          questions.

15          One is just to clarify, Sanitation  
16          and PD -- and who picks the cars without  
17          the license plate, number one.

18          Number two, probably not your issue,  
19          but we know in Manhattan there's no tow  
20          pound. You know, to the credit of  
21          Andrew Cuomo, he closed the one in  
22          Manhattan and we've not been able to  
23          find them.

24          So, some of my concern is -- that I  
25          hear from the PD -- is there's no place

1 to put the cars once they tow them, and  
2 so I'm just interested in the bigger  
3 picture of abandoned cars, how do we  
4 handle them, and where do they go.

5 That's more, like, questions than  
6 testimony, but I can tell you, it's not  
7 clear necessarily to people trying to  
8 make the complaint and actually the  
9 Mayor asked me about it recently cause  
10 he didn't know.

11 So, I would love to have a  
12 clarification. I don't know if that's  
13 relevant to today, but that's why I'm on  
14 this call and I appreciate you doing  
15 this.

16 MS. LIGUORI: Thank you so much,  
17 Council Member Brewer.

18 Unfortunately, the public hearing is  
19 really not for "Q" and "A", but I would  
20 be more --

21 MS. BREWER: Okay.

22 MS. LIGUORI: -- happy -- and our  
23 staff would be more than happy to  
24 discuss all of these matters with you  
25 offline.

1 MS. BREWER: Sounds great.

2 MS. LIGUORI: But -- if that is okay  
3 with you. I will have either Rebecca  
4 Kriegman or Miranda Alquist reach out to  
5 you directly. We can have a meeting,  
6 and we can discuss all of your  
7 questions, and hopefully get some  
8 resolution for you if that works.

9 MS. BREWER: Okay. That would be  
10 great, but I think my testimony is, it  
11 is confusing to the public to understand  
12 how and when cars are towed, and where  
13 they go, and who is Sanitation towing  
14 and who is PD towing.

15 That's my testimony today. Thank  
16 you.

17 MS. LIGUORI: Thank you very much,  
18 Council Member Brewer.

19 If anyone wishes to testify, you may  
20 indicate so in the chat or use the  
21 "raise hand" function.

22 (Whereupon, there was no response.)

23 (Record remained open.)

24 MS. LIGUORI: Thank you, everyone,  
25 for attending today's hearing.
