EDUCATION

DID YOU KNOW?

IN NYC, YOU ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND SCHOOL FROM AGE SIX THROUGH THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR IN WHICH YOU TURN 17. IF NO DIPLOMA HAS BEEN GRANTED, YOU MAY REMAIN IN SCHOOL UNTIL THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR IN WHICH YOU TURN 21.

The NYCDOE also offers high school diploma options for students who have fallen behind, such as transfer schools and **Young Adult Borough Centers (YABCs)**.

For YABCs Students:

- Must be 17 ½-21 years of age
- Have a minimum of 17 course credits; be in the fifth year (or more) of high school
- Be enrolled or become enrolled in a NYC high school. Students must have completed the school year when they turn 17 (school year begins July 1)

For **Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC)** (formerly GED) Students:

- Students must be 21 years old or older
- Programming with the Office of Adult and Continuing Education, or in a community-based TASC (formerly GED) program
- Court representatives are available to assist family court to acquire information that supports court-involved students in achieving their goals
- Department of Education Court Liaison Contacts - The mission is to help courtinvolved students, their families, and the agencies that support the students in continuing their education.
