

PA2 CONSTRUCTION CRITERIA

This plan will be reviewed and approved by DDC Construction to ensure the criteria is met:

- Allows access to Asser Levy Park in 2020, Stuyvesant Cove Park in 2021, and Murphy Brothers Playground in 2022 to **minimize park closures**
- Stuyvesant Cove Park construction to be phased to keep half of the park open to the community
- Open park areas during construction will have **supported amenities**
- Safe pedestrian access is maintained to open areas during phased construction



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SOILS & ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING DURING CONSTRUCTION

REMINDER: ESCR SOIL TEST DATA

- EIS includes information on Environmental borings and hazardous materials, in coordination with DEC, publicly reviewed in 2019 https://www1.nyc.gov/site/escr/about/environmental-review.page
- As part of the EIS, historical data, field observations, laboratory analysis of soil, and groundwater samples were analyzed in Spring 2015, Summer 2016, and Summer 2019. The findings from these investigations are detailed in the FEIS (<u>Chapter 5.7-Hazardous Materials</u>) which has gone through a multi-year review process, extensive community comments and culminated in an approved Record of Decision in 2019
- The FEIS also provides an assessment of hazardous materials during construction
 (Chapter 6.6, Construction—HazardousMaterials) and how applicable federal, state, and local laws
 and guidelines and the implementation of measures such as air monitoring, proper storage and handling
 of materials, and, if required, odor suppression, the potential for significant adverse effects related to
 hazardous materials would be avoided. All soil and groundwater management during construction would
 be implemented in accordance with a project Remedial Action Plan, which will be approved by DEP

ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING NYC DDC COMMITMENT

The City has committed to noise and air quality monitoring during construction

- Noise and air quality commitments/mitigation made in FEIS and Record of Decision issued for ESCR
- Contractors will comply with *all* applicable laws and regulations
- Contract documents include requirements and mitigation

Requirements

- Contractor must submit Noise Monitoring Plan and Air Quality Monitoring Plan
- · Monitors will move based on location of construction

Enforcement

- Monitoring Plans must be approved by NYC DDC
- Alerts sent automatically if thresholds exceeded
- Oversight of construction activities
 - On-site Inspectors will monitor contractor work
 - Environmental Specialist will oversee compliance

- 4. Throughout the life of the contract DDC & HNTB-LiRo monitors status of commitment and performs outreach to Section 3 and M/WBE community
