Small Business Services

What We Do?

Helps unlock economic potential and create economic security for all New Yorkers by connecting New Yorkers to good jobs, creating stronger businesses, and building thriving neighborhoods across the five boroughs.

Section 3- At a Glance

What is Section 3?

A Provision, established in 1968, that ensures employment and other economic opportunities generated by certain HUD financial assistance shall, to the greatest extent feasible, and consistent with existing Federal, State and local laws and regulations, be directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly those who are recipients of government assistance for housing (NYCHA, Section 8)

Applies to:

Housing Rehab/Construction and Other public construction, receiving at least \$200,000 in HUD funding

East Side Coastal Resiliency is a Section 3 Eligible project

Goal- Bringing economic opportunities to the residents and businesses of NYC, with a focus on the Lower East Side, Chinatown, and Lower Manhattan

Construction Trainings available at Workforce1

SBS has two types of construction trainings that are available through Workforce1, Pre-Apprenticeship and Site Safety Training(s).

Pre-Apprenticeship Training, an occupational training to prepare new-entrants for Apprenticeships in the Union building trades.

Site Safety Training, a safety credential required for construction workers in NYC. This is an awareness level training and NOT an occupational training.

Inquiries for more information can now be done online. Both trainings are FREE.

Pre-Apprenticeship Program

Purpose

Pre-Apprenticeship program offers a unique pathway to Union career opportunities in the NYC Construction Trades. Workforce1 partners with 4 organizations that have direct-entry agreements with the Unions, so their graduates have special consideration when interviews open for new Apprenticeship roles.

Target Audience

- Over 18 years of age
- NYC resident
- High School Diploma/Equivalency
- Test for Adult Basic Education (TABE)
- Valid ID & SSN Card
- Section 3 residents: residents of NYCHA, residents who family income fall under “low or very low income”

Data

- Typically enrolls over 100 participants between the three primary providers
- 70% of enrollees from High Poverty Zip Codes
- 20% of enrollees NYCHA residents
- 90% completion rate
- Average Annual Salary could be as high as \$30-40hr
- Enrollees entered in various unions: Ornamental Iron, General Laborers, Painters, Plumbers, etc.

Site Safety Training (SST) – Local Law 196

Local Law 196: requires that an agency designated by the Mayor develop a program to provide equal access to Site Safety training.

[Workers on job sites that require at Site Safety Plan](#) must have 40 hours of SST training or 10 hours of SST training if they already have the OSHA 30

Who Can Apply

- Over 18 years of age
- NYC Residents who are over 18 years of age
- Interested and able to work in construction

How It Works

- Eligibility is determined
- Resident creates schedule
- Resident finishes training course
- SBS certifies card and ensures delivery to resident

Additional Information

- SBS will only print Site Safety Training Cards.
- Valid OSHA 30 is accepted as a substitute for SBS 30
- Centers will collect cards from SBS
- Instructor Led is primary training method

Construction Site Safety Training

What will I learn?

The Construction Site Safety Training (SST) virtual course will provide you with the required training to work on most construction jobs sites in NYC. The training is provided at no-cost and will help you obtain your [SST card](#).

For those with no prior training, this course provides 30 hours of [Occupational Safety and Health Administration \(OSHA\)](#) training, eight hours of fall prevention training, and two hours of drug and alcohol awareness training.

For those with a valid [OSHA 30-hour card](#) received in the last five years, SBS provides a fast track to earn your [SST card](#) by completing the final 10 hours of training (eight hours of fall prevention training, and two hours of drug and alcohol awareness training).
