### PA1 | Full Phase 2 Transition | End of August 2025




### PA1 | Overnight Closure of Track & Field and Field 6

- Temporary, limited closures in open areas may be required for soil sampling during the day




### PA1 | No Parking: FDR Service Rd at E. 6<sup>th</sup> Street

- One lane of traffic and access to buildings will be maintained at all times, sidewalk access may be temporarily limited




## PA1 | Nightwork: FDR Drive Utility Crossings

- Cherry Street: Electrical conduit installation
- Between Delancey St. and E. Houston Street: Water installation
- Expected to begin within next six weeks and each will continue for 4-6 weeks
- Requires overnight work hours across the FDR Drive due to DOT permits and FDR Drive lane closures
- Operation can be disruptive and loud due to roadway excavations
- Formal advisories will be issued when timeline is finalized





### **Delancey St. Pedestrian Bridge**

- Emergency Access: reiterating Emergency Access Plan with local response agencies and CB3 District Cabinet
- **Entry:** upgraded barrier to prevent vehicular entry, bollards to be installed under ESCR at a later date
- Signage: coordinating with Parks on improved signage to emphasize operating hours

### PA1 | What We've Heard

- Greenway / Pinch Point: Request for Qualifications (RFQ)
   released March 11
- Fireboat House / Section 106 Process: OMB, DDC, Parks working on responses to Alternatives Analysis comments received from the consulting parties
- Esplanade Width: varies from roughly 7-8 feet in narrowest areas (including furniture) to over 30 feet in widest areas
- Plantings: landscape team continues to monitor plant health as spring season progresses
- Plant ID markers: Parks response


