












#### **Artwork Description**

Joined an avalanche, never to be alone again is a three-part temporary art installation on a city-funded resiliency project, consisting of a 1:1 scale low-tide wave made of 100% recycled asphalt, a geotechnical core sample installation, and salvaged fencing from the FDR Drive.


The work examines how we as humans have accelerated a global environmental crisis. It explores the complexity of the industrial systems we inhabit within a larger ecosystem, where inert matter and the landscapes surrounding us are expressed by living agents, and we humans, just an arrangement of minerals and water, have a symbiotic commitment to the fragile systems we inhabit. Through this lens, the city can be seen as a living, dynamic organism, part of an evolutionary process of continual change.








PANNOTIA FDR FENCING WAVE



#### **Pannotia**

This piece of the installation is part of the artist's ongoing Pannotia <u>series</u>, and will take place in the gap between the temporary bridge and promenade, where an installation made of geotechnical drillings (core samples) will show the dynamism of geology.





#### The Fence

As part of the intervention, the artist proposes to reclaim the old FDR Drive fence featuring symbolism from this coasts history and habitat, like the crab, the seahorse and the beaver. With this fence and mockups from the flood wall we are arranging approximately 70' of reclaimed fencing for a better understanding of the history, past and future of this location.



#### The Wave

The proposed idea is a 1:1 scale low tide wave.
