EAST SIDE COASTAL RESILIENCY PROJECT



The East Side Coastal Resiliency (ESCR) project will protect 110,000 New Yorkers from the impacts of climate change by reducing flood risk to communities, properties, businesses, critical infrastructure, and public open spaces. In addition to providing flood protection, the project will strengthen and enhance waterfront spaces on Manhattan's East Side by improving accessibility, increasing ecological diversity, and delivering improved recreational amenities to a vibrant and highly diverse community.

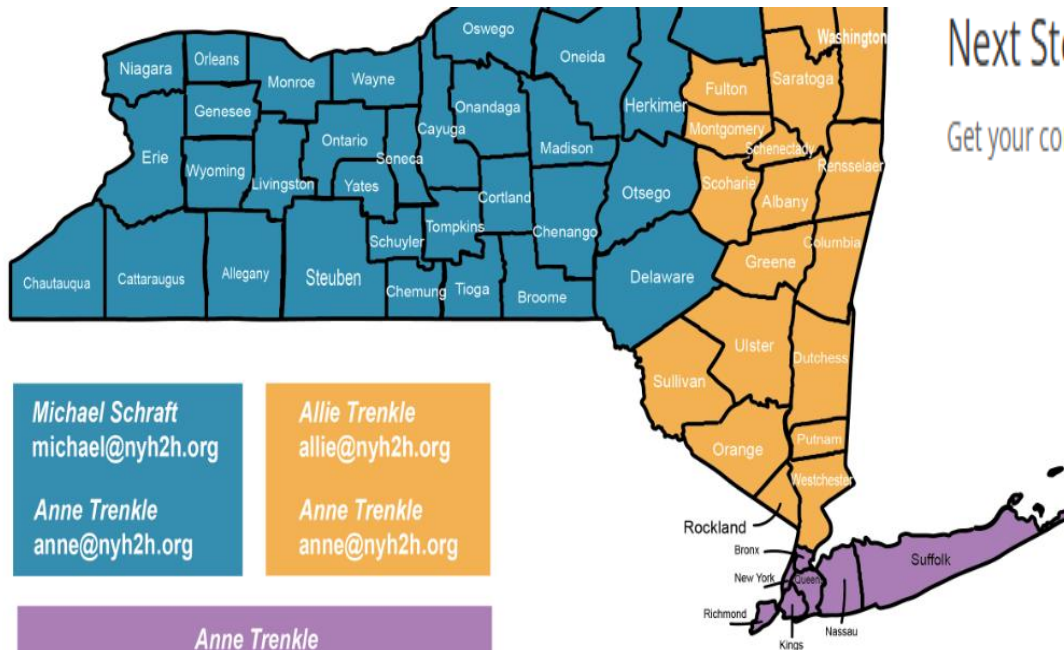

A union construction career is a solid pathway to a stable middle-class life. Wages can start at over \$50,000/year, plus health insurance and retirement benefits.

Pathways to Apprenticeship (P2A) helps people from underserved and underrepresented communities learn about, prepare for, apply to, and be accepted into union apprenticeship programs that lead to steady careers.

- 0 18 YEARS OR OLDER

P2A has a direct entry pre-apprenticeship program that is full time, 5 weeks long (Monday - Friday from 8:30am - 4:30pm), after which you can interview with many of the building trades unions including the Laborers, Ironworker's, Plumbers, Painters, Electricians, and more.

P2A also sends out updates on apprenticeship openings, helps people to complete their apprenticeship applications and to prepare for interviews. We also mentor participants through the apprenticeship and beyond.

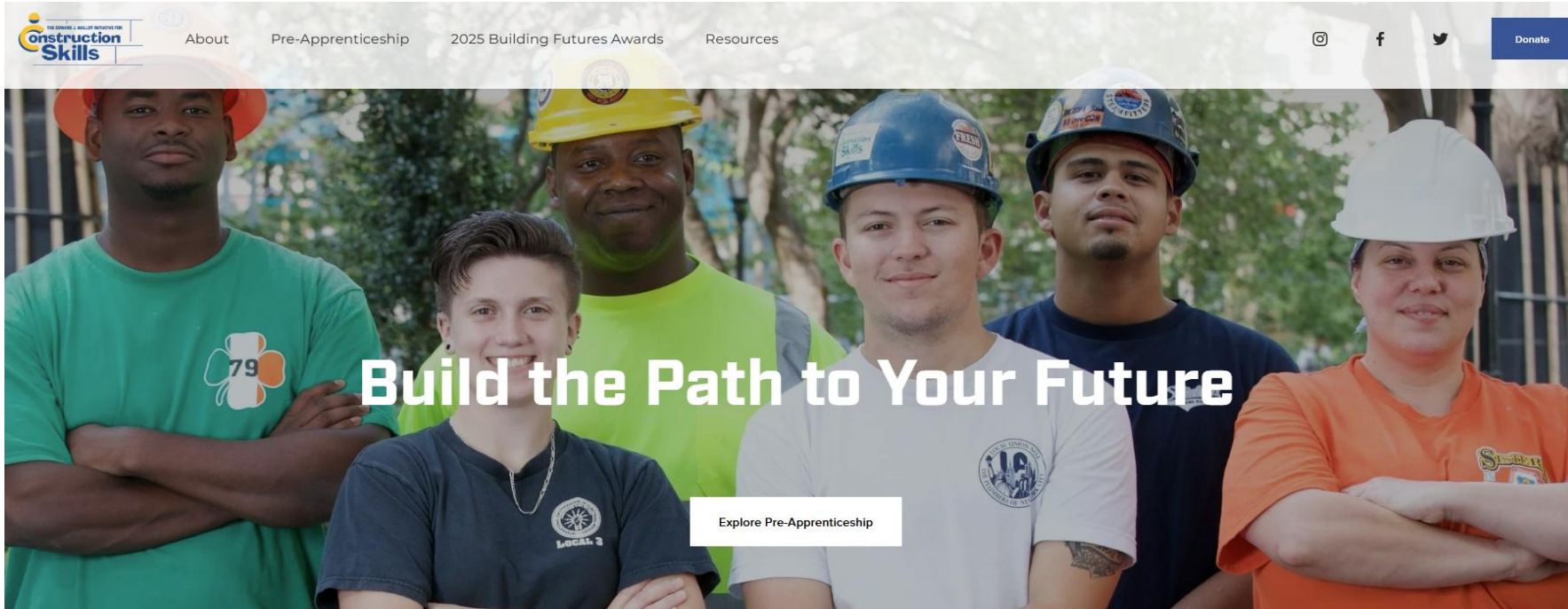


Since its founding in 2013 by a small group of passionate volunteers, Pathways to Apprenticeship (P2A) has opened doors to opportunity for more than **450 individuals** from low-income communities—over **60%** of whom have been formerly incarcerated. Through P2A's guidance and support, these individuals have gained admission to Building Trades apprenticeship programs that offer a clear path to stable, middle-class careers.

The results speak for themselves: more than **80%** of P2A graduates remain employed in the building trades today. Many have advanced to become journey workers and shop stewards—respected leaders in their unions. Others have returned to P2A as Peer Mentors, assisting in the classroom, sharing their experiences, and inspiring the next generation to follow in their footsteps.

Every success story represents more than one individual's transformation—it's a family lifted out of poverty, a community strengthened, and a powerful step toward a more equitable New York. 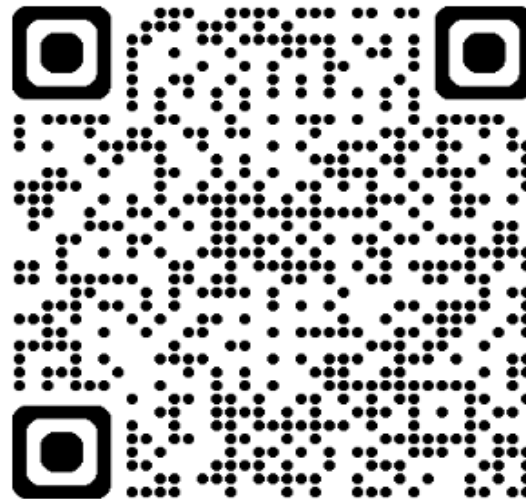
