### 3 Steps to Join a Construction Union

#### Enroll in an Apprenticeship

By enrolling in an apprenticeship through a construction union, you get training for the trade that interests you, a salary while training, and eligibility for union membership. Apprenticeships last two to four years and combine on-the-job training with classroom instruction in a specific trade. The **U.S. Department of Labor** also provides public information about construction apprenticeships and the standards that union programs must meet. Your state labor offices usually have resources for enrolling in construction trades training programs, too.

#### Apply for Membership

If you are already working in the construction industry and have several years of qualifying experience, you can apply for membership directly with the union that represents workers in your trade. Each union has its own experience requirements, but it considers your application if your education and work experience fit the membership profile.

#### Join Through an Employer

If you work for an employer or construction contractor that has an existing union contract, you'll often have the opportunity to join the union at your workplace. In some cases, employers prohibit union activities in the workplace, so don't contact the union representative before you understand the proper procedure for your specific employer. The law doesn't always require your employer to inform you of the right to join a union. However, you can contact the union's local or national office directly to get information about the process for joining the union in your workplace.

### Join a Local Union: Local 731, Local 1010, District Council of Carpenters

These local labor unions, affiliated with ESCR Project, offer apprenticeship opportunities, skills training, and career pathways in construction and building trades. Union membership provides job security, healthcare, and pension benefits.


