First Steps to Doing Business with the City

Create vendor accounts in both:

<u>City's Payee Information Portal (PIP)</u>

<u>Procurement and Sourcing Solutions Portal (PASSPort)</u>

<u>If</u> you are interested in contracting with the Department of Education, also create a vendor profile on <u>VPortal</u>

Department of Homeless Services

The NYC Department of Education Office of Food and Nutrition Services
(OFNS) uses its own vendor portal for
procurement, outside of PASSPort, **called**VPortal, which can be found here.
Vendors have to make a vendor profile,
just like on PASSPort.

Open contracts for the NYC Department of Homeless Services (DHS) are posted to PASSPort and included on their Contracts & Procurement page, however, the majority of food contracts are through subcontracting.

About 9 of the DHS shelters procure meals through Requests for Proposals (RFPs), which are posted to PASSPort.

There is guidance for how to look for these under the Requests for Proposals dropdown menu of the Contracts & Procurement page.

OFNS purchases food to prepare on site at schools through bids, which are posted as **open Requests for Bids (CSBs and BVBs)** on their infohub, under the dropdown menu For Prospective Vendors. Open bids can be found here.

Their <u>infohub</u> also hosts other useful information and a **vendor hotline** to assist vendors and answer questions.

Other shelters are run by nonprofit providers, who procure food and meals through RFPs, also, through subcontracting. These subcontracts have to be approved by the City.

Department for the Aging – Home-Delivered Meals (HDMs) and Older Adult Centers (OACs)

Contract opportunities for the NYC
Department for the Aging are posted to
PASSPort.

On PASSPort you can view NYC Aging's

Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for food
and meal vendors. Many NYC Aging
funded programs for HDMs and OACs are
run by nonprofit providers, who may
subcontract for meal services, which
must be approved by NYC Aging.

NYC Aging also provides **training videos for the RFP process**, as well as more **explanation of their food buying process.** These resources can be

Community Food Connection (CFC) provides food to nearly 700 pantries across NYC. CFC typically contracts one food distributor through a Request for Proposal (RFP) procurement process.

When CFC is seeking a new distributor contract, it is posted to PASSPort as an RFP. The distributor then buys from vendors and provides those goods to CFC sites.

Health and Hospitals - Patient Meals

Department of Corrections

NYC Health and Hospitals (H&H) has a centrally-managed patient dining program that contracts with one primary vendor. H&H procures this patient dining vendor using Requests for Proposals (RFPs). These are posted publicly to City Record Online, a contract notifications platform, when the RFP is open and in progress.

The contracted vendor is then responsible for the **purchasing and distribution of food and other products**related to patient dining services at NYC
Health + Hospitals.

Department of Youth and Community

Development - Cornerstone Community

Centers

The NYC Department of Corrections
(DOC) procures food through
Competitive Sealed Bids (CSBs) and Best
Value Bids (BVBs). These bids are posted
to PASSPort.

Procurement and contracting for DOC is handled by the Department of Citywide Administrative Services. Meals and snacks are then prepared on site on Rikers Island.

Administration for Children's Services

The Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD) procures meals and snacks through a Request for Proposals (RFPs) process.

Open DYCD proposals can be found posted to PASSPort.

The NYC Administration for Children's Services (ACS) procures food through Competitive Sealed Bids (CSBs) and Best Value Bids (BVBs). These bids are posted to PASSPort.

Procurement and contracting for ACS is handled by the Department of Citywide Administrative Services. Meals and snacks are then prepared on site at the two youth detention facilities.
