You've made it this far. Now, let's finish strong.

Temporary Housing Services is a non-profit partnership that helps homeowners in Build it Back through the last step of their housing recovery. We're here to help you find and pay for temporary housing so you can keep your finances stable while Build it Back elevates or rebuilds your home.

Who is it for? Pre-approved homeowners who need temporary rental housing while their home is under construction with Build It Back.

What does it pay for? Financial assistance is available to help you secure an apartment, move, and pay monthly rent. These services are available if Build it Back construction requires you to be out of your home.

**How does it work?** Call us at (646)-757-2886. If you're pre-approved, we will pay your rent, fees, and deposit on your behalf -- you won't need to pay out of pocket. If you would like help finding a place to move, our staff can help you search our clearinghouse of apartments. Additional support is available for New Yorkers who are elderly or infirm or have other special needs.

Where are the temporary apartments located? Rentals are available in NYC and the metro area. We will make every effort to help residents stay as close to their current neighborhoods as possible and accommodate special access or functional needs.
