



- Belmont Ave commercial revitalization pilot
- Parks without Borders concepts incorporated into Betsy Head Park designs
- Brownsville RFP designation summer 2018

#### In Progress:

- Livonia Avenue Streetscape Plan
- New mixed-use affordable developments on vacant lots:
  - 4 developments currently under construction
  - More in still early stages of design and development



# 02 IMPROVE CONNECTIONS THROUGHOUT THE NEIGHBORHOOD

#### Complete and/or ongoing:

- Promote cycling in Brownsville
- Expanded bike lane in Thomas Boyland
- CPTED\* public realm audits and creation of Action Plans with stakeholder teams at Brownsville and Van Dyke Houses
- Neighborhood Activation grants totaling \$50,000 to 3 Black Cats, BMS, and their partners to curate cultural programming in summer 2018-spring 2019.

#### In Progress:

- Implementation of CPTED\* Action Plans and Neighborhood Activation programming
- Pedestrian improvements to ENY

#### Complete and/or ongoing:

- Funded groups to conduct art and cultural programming in Brownsville parks
- Continue contracting with PAL and BCJC to offer youth programming
- Extended summer hours at 6 NYCHA community centers
- Installed new lights and cameras at Van Dyke and Brownsville Houses
- Activate Osborn Plaza as the NYCx Co-Lab anchor site

#### In progress:

- Newport Playground renovations began this summer
- Betsy Head Phase I construction began in December, Phase II anticipated start summer 2019
- New public plaza as part of Rockaway site in Brownsville RFP

- Opened Brownsville Houses Teen Lounge
- Launched the Neighborhood Health Action Center; continue providing family wellness and health programming
- Continue increasing opportunities to grow fresh produce
- Continue Shop Healthy NYC to increase availability of healthier foods in Brownsville stores

#### In progress:

- Procurement for construction of BRC
- Brownsville RFP theme of Healthy Living and Food Systems for Livonia sites



# 05 CONNECT BROWNSVILLE RESIDENTS TO JOBS AND JOB TRAINING

#### Complete and/or ongoing:

- Launched 3-K for All
- Provide opportunities to bring computer science education to Brownsville schools (CS4all)
- Enrolled 2,851 Brownsville youth in the 2018 Summer Youth Employment Program
- Trained 3 cohorts of Brownsville youth in the Young Innovators Program pilot
- Recruited and trained 17 Brownsville youth in the Green City Force service corps program

#### In Progress:

- Promote coordination among Brownsville stakeholders involved in providing access to job training and connections to jobs
- Brownsville RFP included Innovation and Entrepreneurship theme, and required targeted workforce outreach plans

# 06 SUPPORT SMALL BUSINESSES AND ASPIRING ENTREPRENEURS

#### Complete and/or ongoing:

- Launched an East Brooklyn IBZ marketing campaign and promote local sourcing
- Supported the Pitkin Avenue BID in retail attraction/retention and implementing five storefront improvements
- Assisted 79 Brownsville small businesses through 3 SBS' Chamber On-the-Go visits

#### In progress:

- SBS to host a commercial leasing workshop in Brownsville
- Rehabilitation of 181 Powell St
- New spaces for small businesses in Brownsville RFP sites
- Coordinate a networking event to encourage local subcontractor participation in Brownsville RFP with winning development teams

# 07 IMPROVE HOUSING STABILITY AND SUPPORT RESIDENTS AT RISK OF DISPLACEMENT

#### Complete and/or ongoing:

- Construction and lease up of 603 Mother Gaston Blvd and 91 Junius St
- Supporting homeowners to prevent foreclosure and preserve affordability
- Hosting tenant and homeowner/landlord resource fairs and property owner clinics
- Providing anti-eviction free legal services and/or Homebase homelessness prevention services
- Established a Certification of No Harassment Pilot Program (CONH) – effective Sep 2018
- Training Housing Ambassadors (currently 3 in Brownsville)

#### In progress:

 Development of city-owned small infill sites for affordable rentals and co-op homeownership for first-time buyers

- Hosted Brownsville RFP networking session to promote local partnerships
- Continue supporting Brownsville organizations to promote health and community development
- Continue convening regular NSTAT meetings
- Extended EBACA technical support to June 2018 to enable strategic planning
- Created the Brownsville Community Tech Advisory Board; launched two NYCx Co-Lab Challenges

#### In progress:

 Development of the Brownsville Arts Center at the Rockaway-Chester RFP site
