



PROGRESS UPDATES

01 PROMOTE ACTIVE MIXED-USE CORRIDORS



Rockaway Ave station under the elevated train - DOT



Rendering of Ebenezer Plaza, 532 affordable homes for a range of incomes that will include ground-floor retail space, community facility space, and new church sanctuary. Phase I began construction in July 2018, and Phase II will begin summer 2019.

Completed 2017-2019:

- Belmont Ave commercial revitalization pilot
- Parks without Borders concepts incorporated into Betsy Head Park designs
- Brownsville RFP designation summer 2018

In Progress:

- Rockaway Ave MTA station pilot pedestrian lighting and finalizing the Livonia Avenue Streetscape Plan
- New mixed-use affordable developments on vacant lots:
 - About 700 homes in developments currently under construction or starting construction this summer
 - 400 homes to complete in 2020
 - More in still early stages of design and development


Complete and/or ongoing:

- Neighborhood Activation grants totaling \$50,000 to 3 Black Cats, BMS, and their partners to curate cultural programming in summer 2018-spring 2019.

- "Safe Places, Active Spaces! A Community Guide to Transforming Public Spaces in Your Neighborhood
- Bike lane improvements, including a protected lane proposal for Powell St
- Pedestrian improvements to ENY at Sutter Ave

- Installed new lights and cameras at Van Dyke and Brownsville Houses
- Activate Osborn Plaza as the NYCx Co-Lab anchor site

In progress:

- Newport Playground renovations
- Betsy Head Park renovations Phase I construction began in December 2018, Phase II anticipated start summer 2019, comfort station renovation anticipated for fall 2019
- New public plaza as part of Rockaway site in Brownsville RFP

- Opened Brownsville Houses Teen Lounge
- Launched the Neighborhood Health Action Center; continue providing family wellness and health programming
- Continue increasing opportunities to grow and distribute fresh produce
- Supported Youthmarkets
- Helped 117 stores increase availability of healthier foods through Shop Healthy NYC
- Funding for Isabahlia to offer nutrition education program for Van Dyke residents
- Expand organics collection in Brownsville

In progress:

- Permitting and procurement for construction of Brownsville Rec Center renovation
- Brownsville RFP theme of Healthy Living and Food Systems for Livonia sites

Complete and/or ongoing:

- Launched 3-K for All in District 23, served 600 3-year olds in 2018-2019 school year
- Provide opportunities to bring computer science education to schools (CS4all)
- Enrolled 2,851 Brownsville youth in the 2018 Summer Youth Employment Program
- 55 Brownsville youth trained in the Young Innovators Program pilot
- Continue recruiting and training Brownsville youth in the Green City Force program

In Progress:

- Promote coordination among Brownsville stakeholders involved in providing access to job training and connections to jobs
- Brownsville RFP included Innovation and Entrepreneurship theme, and required targeted workforce outreach plans

Complete and/or ongoing:

- Launched an East Brooklyn IBZ marketing campaign and promote local sourcing
- Supported the Pitkin Avenue BID in retail attraction/retention and implementing six storefront improvements with \$230,000 in NYS funding
- Assisted 100+ Brownsville small businesses through 3 SBS' Chamber On-the-Go visits and 2 mobile unit events

In progress:

- Renovation of 181 Powell St industrial bldg
- New spaces for small businesses in Brownsville RFP sites
- Coordinate a networking event to encourage local subcontractor participation in Brownsville RFP with winning development teams

- Construction and lease up of 603 Mother Gaston Blvd and 91 Junius St
- Supporting homeowners, property owners, and preserving affordability
- Hosting tenant and homeowner/landlord resource fairs and property owner clinics
- Providing anti-eviction free legal services and Homebase homelessness prevention services
- Established a Certification of No Harassment Pilot Program (CONH) – effective Sep 2018
- Training Housing Ambassadors (currently 3 in Brownsville)

In progress:

 Development of City-owned infill sites for affordable rentals and co-op homeownership for first-time buyers

- Created the Brownsville Community Tech Advisory Board and launched two NYCx Co-Lab Challenges
- Continue supporting Brownsville organizations to promote health and community development
- Continue convening regular NSTAT meetings

In progress:

 Development of the Brownsville Arts Center at the Rockaway-Chester RFP site

- Brownsville Plan Second Annual Progress Report release
- Fall 2019 RFP for funding for community gardens to increase capacity

- Completion of Rockaway/Livonia pilot lighting project and anticipated release of the Livonia Streetscape Plan
