


1. Introduction



 - Community engagement for affordable housing development on City-owned land!




Introduction The New York Public Library (NYPL)



Introduction The Grand Concourse Branch

- Multi-story facility with adult, young adult, and children's collections.
- Dedicated children's area, teen center, adult reading room, and community room.
 - Offers free NYPL After School help, College and Career Pathways Hub
 - 3-D printing, Teen recording studio and video and photography equipment.

Project and Site Overview Site Description and Context

- 155 East 173rd Street, Bronx, Community District 4
- 8,864 SF lot
- Three blocks from the B/D line (174-175 Street)
- R8 zoning district
- Across the street from the Claremont BronxCare campus; near P.S. 70, P.S. 402, and Claremont Park.



Project and Site Overview Building Details

- Year Built: 1959
- Existing Building:
 - Multi-story brick and masonry
- Ownership: City
- Current Funding:
 - \$13.5 million in City Capital funding is currently allocated for facade and HVAC-related work



Project and Site Overview A New Grand Concourse Library

The new state-of-the-art library will include:

- A welcoming and fully accessible entrance.
- An improved layout for patrons that is easy to navigate and more efficient operations for staff.
- Improved spaces for Children, Teens and Adults; as well as community rooms designed to address program needs.
- All new mechanical systems to better heat and cool the library for improved patron and staff comfort.
- New finishes; including, lighting, flooring, paint; new furniture and collection material.
- Technology and power upgrades.



Project and Site Overview Affordable Housing Development on City-Owned Land

- High quality affordable housing development for many different types of New Yorkers, including:
 - Multifamily housing
 - Senior housing
 - Supportive housing with social services
 - Set-asides for families coming from shelter
 - Homeownership opportunities
- Citywide design standards and project-specific design guidelines.
- Climate resiliency and sustainability requirements.
- Opportunities for minority- and women-owned businesses (M/WBEs) and non-profit developers.

Construction Completion: Spring 2024

- New Inwood library branch
- 174 affordable housing units
- Community center and Universal Pre-K









Precedents Sunset Park Library (BPL)

Construction Completion: Fall 2023

- New Sunset Park library branch
- 49 affordable housing units
- Community space and recording studio


