If the Owner has actual knowledge of a child under six years old residing in the apartment even without receiving the response from the occupant, the Owner must perform an annual visual inspection. **As of January 1, 2020, the term “resides” means that a child under six routinely spends 10 or more hours per week in the dwelling unit.
