The NYC Department of Social Services and Destination Tomorrow Announce First-Ever Transitional Housing Program for Transgender New Yorkers

High-quality Shelter will Offer 150 Beds and Critical Supports to Help TGNC New Yorkers

Experiencing Homelessness Stabilize Their Lives

Ace's Place will Be the First City Shelter for Transgender Individuals in The Nation

NEW YORK – The NYC Department of Social Services (DSS) and Destination Tomorrow today announced the opening of Ace's Place, the country's first-ever city-funded shelter dedicated to serving and supporting Transgender and gender non-conforming (TGNC) individuals experiencing homelessness. Against the backdrop of a sustained attack on Transgender rights nationwide, this landmark moment serves to strengthen New York City's legacy as a sanctuary for the LGBTQ+community. Ace's Place will provide high-quality transitional housing and specialized support for TGNC New Yorkers experiencing homelessness. Through this first-of-its-kind program, the city stands as a beacon of safety, dignity, and empowerment for TGNC community members navigating housing insecurity. This program will employ innovative approaches to support shelter residents, including a culinary arts program, taking advantage of Destination Tomorrow's two state-of-the-art commercial kitchens. At this site, Destination Tomorrow will provide comprehensive wraparound services in a trauma-informed setting while facilitating vital connections to community-based resources.

"We couldn't be prouder to make this historic announcement that strongly affirms our values and commitment to strengthening the safety net for transgender New Yorkers at a time when their rights are roundly under attack," said **Department of Social Services Commissioner Molly Wasow Park**. "Ace's Place will offer Transgender New Yorkers a safe place to heal and stabilize in trauma-informed settings with the support of staff who are deeply invested in their growth and wellbeing. We are grateful to have found an incredible partner in Destination Tomorrow, an organization that is rooted in serving the community and has invaluable expertise in addressing unique barriers to housing for TGNC New Yorkers."

"New York City has long been a leader in advancing LGBTQ+ rights and protections, and we're proud to continue that tradition with the opening of the nation's first city-funded shelter dedicated to supporting transgender individuals," said **Department of Homeless Services Administrator Joslyn Carter**. "We're thrilled to celebrate this milestone alongside Sean Ebony Coleman of Destination Tomorrow, whose tireless advocacy for transgender New Yorkers has been instrumental in creating real, lasting support for those experiencing homelessness in the community."

"This shelter is a hard-fought declaration that our Transgender and gender nonconforming siblings will no longer be pushed to the margins," said **Sean Ebony Coleman, founder and CEO of Destination Tomorrow**. "Ace's Place is a community-driven answer to systemic neglect, and it's only the beginning. Destination Tomorrow is proud to partner with New York City to make this shelter a reality, and we look forward to providing hundreds of TGNC individuals with the holistic services they need to access long-term housing and economic empowerment."

Destination Tomorrow is a national LGBTQ+ organization that serves the community through educational, financial, housing, health and personal support programs. Destination Tomorrow's partnership with DSS reflects this mission and expands the nonprofit's slate of services. The grassroots organization emphasizes providing support to vulnerable members of the LGBTQ+ community that takes them off the path of requiring emergency care, and focusing on economic, social, and mental empowerment.

This site will offer a wide array of on-site and off-site services, providing TGNC New Yorkers with the support that will help them achieve long-term housing and financial agency. On-site services will include case management, individual and group counseling, permanency planning and housing placement assistance, referrals to medical and mental health services, support groups, independent living, life skills and financial literacy workshops, and assistance securing employment and academic supports including college preparation.

There will also be a full-time psychiatric nurse practitioner onsite who will work closely with the social workers and other credentialed staff to provide comprehensive mental health support. Onsite clinical staff will provide health education through coaching and counseling with the end goal of improved health outcomes and increasing clients' self-sufficiency. This model will offer specialized services to address depression, anxiety, and other challenges our residents may experience. Destination Tomorrow will also employ holistic approaches to health and mental wellness with programs offering yoga and meditation. In addition, Destination Tomorrow is developing a work study program for culinary arts, this will provide hands-on experience and internship opportunities for residents seeking careers in hospitality and food service. DSS and Destination Tomorrow will work closely with key community stakeholders to identify collaborative ways to better serve and support New York City's thriving LGBTQ+ community.

It continues to show what we have always known — that Trans people are the ones taking care of each other, from elders to youth, from healthcare to housing and beyond. I'm proud to stand in solidarity with this groundbreaking step toward equity and care."
