History, Significance and Notable Characteristics 687B Greenwich Street is a home in the Greenwich Street Mews, which were built in 1989. The Mews replaced two storage buildings of a trucking freight terminal, which had themselves replaced five original houses on the site in 1945.

The Greenwich Street Mews is a private gated enclave made up of seven three-story brick townhouses. The use of brick, doublehung windows, and traditional townhouse proportions reflects the historic aesthetic of the neighborhood, while the design incorporates modern elements to meet contemporary living standards.

The Greenwich Mews exemplifies a thoughtful integration of new construction within a historic context, balancing respect for traditional architectural forms with the needs of modern urban living

Alterations Replace and relocate four rear windows, and add a new bulkhead
























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



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PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK AT REAR FACADE:

- REMOVE 4 EXISTING WINDOWS
- INFILL WITH MASONRY OPENINGS WITH BRICKS TO MATCH EXISITNG
- CREATE 4 NEW WINDOWS WITH NEW MASONRY OPENINGS
- NEW LINTELS AND SILLS TO MATCH EXISTING
- NEW BULKHEAD (SEE NEXT SECTION)



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



Windows B, C, and D are to match the existing twin double-hungs on the front facade with six-over-one configurations. Unit A's facade on Greenwich Street also has twin double-hungs with six-over-one configurations.

Window A is more narrow than the other new windows. So, we are proposing a double-hung with four-over-one configuration as its proportions work better for the masonry opening. Unit A's facade on Greenwich Street also has four-overone windows on top of six-over-one windows. Therefore combining the window styles is also relevant.

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

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


