










To the Mayor, the Council, and the Commissioner, NYC Department of Parks and Recreation.

This report is issued pursuant to Section 25-318 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which requires a report from the Landmarks Preservation Commission for plans for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or demolition of any improvement or proposed improvement which is owned by the City or is to be constructed upon property owned by the City and is or is to be located on a landmark site or in a historic district or which contains an interior landmark.

At the Public Meeting of July 24, 2012, following the Public Hearing of the same date, the Landmarks Preservation Commission voted to issue a positive report for establishing a three year master plan governing the seasonal installations at the subject premises, as put forward in your application completed June 28, 2012.

The proposed work, as approved, consists of establishing a master plan governing future seasonal installations, including interactive art installations, tents, movable furniture and portable structures at the following locations including the lawn, the hardscape (paved) areas surrounding the lawn, the fountain terrace area, the corner of Sixth Avenue and West 42nd Street, the northern portion of the upper terrace at the rear of the New York Public Library, a portion of the sidewalk along West 42nd Street, the Fifth Avenue terrace in front of the New York Public Library; as shown in the presentation boards containing photographs of previously approved seasonal installations, photographs of the sites post-installation and marked site plans, all labeled L-001.00, L-002.00, L-003.00, L-004.00, L-005.00 and L-006.00, dated issued June 31, 2012, submitted as components of the application, and presented at the Public Meeting and Public Hearing.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission notes that the scenic landmark designation report describes Bryant Park as a formal French-style garden designed in 1933 by Lusby Simpson and reconstructed and partially redesigned by Hanna/Olin in 1988-91.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission found that the presence of temporary installations at these specified locations throughout this scenic landmark including the lawn the stone pathways around the perimeter of the lawn including the upper terrace and around the fountain near 6th Avenue, a portion of the concrete sidewalk along West 42nd Street and within the Fifth Avenue stone terrace, will not diminish the relationship between the park and the surrounding buildings and streetscapes; that the proposed installations, including tents, seating, art installations and portable event structures will be installed on a seasonal basis for less than one year; that the temporary installations will not cause damage to significant protected scenic features of the specified sites; that the proposed installations will not penetrate the ground surface; that an acceptable plan and time schedule for the dismantling of the seasonal installations for when the temporary installation permits expire will be submitted to the Commission as a component of future applications; that repairs to the grounds will be made in-kind at the close of each season; that the proposed Master Plan is being approved as a test case, and will expire after a term of three (3) years on July 24, 2015 to enable the Commission to assess the impact of this type of seasonal installations within this scenic landmark; and that the cumulative impact of these temporary installations will not detract from the significant landscape features of the Bryant Park Scenic Landmark. As shown in drawings labeled L-001.00, L-002.00, L-003.00, L-004.00, L-005.00 and L-006.00, dated issued June 31, 2012, prepared by Bryant Park Corp. Based on this and the above findings Advisory - Commission Report 13-4440 (LPC 13-0241) is being issued.

This report is issued on the basis of the building and site conditions described in the application and disclosed during the review process. By accepting this permit, the applicant agrees to notify the Commission if the actual building or site conditions vary or if original or historic building fabric is discovered. The Commission reserves the right to amend or revoke this permit, upon written notice to the applicant, in the event that the actual building or site conditions are materially different from those described in the application or disclosed during the review process.

All approved drawings are marked approved by the Commission with a perforated seal indicating the date of approval. The work is limited to what is contained in the perforated documents. Other work or amendments to this filing must be reviewed and approved separately. This report constitutes the permit; a copy must be prominently displayed at the site while work is in progress. This report is issued pursuant to Section 25-318 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which requires a report from the Landmarks Preservation Commission for plans for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or demolition of any improvement or proposed improvement which is owned by the City or is to be constructed upon property owned by the City and is or is to be located on a landmark site or in a historic district or which contains an interior landmark.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission, at the Public Meeting of January 19, 2016, following the Public Hearing of the same date, voted to issue a positive report for the establishment of a Master Plan governing seasonal installations at the subject premises, as put forward in your application completed on December 17, 2015.

The proposal as approved, consists of the establishment of a master plan governing future temporary seasonal installations for a period of ten years; including the installation of an ice rink, portable structures, tents, shop structures, stage platforms, and small-scale portable structures; to be installed at the lawn, gravel paths, the allées, the Upper Terrace, the Fountain Terrace on 6th Avenue, the 5th Avenue Terrace in front of the New York Public Library, and a portion of the sidewalk on 42nd Street. The proposal was shown on twenty-six presentation slides dated January 19, 2016, prepared by Craig LaCruba, R.L.A. of the Bryant Park Corporation, and submitted as components of the application and presented at the Public Hearing and Public Meeting.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission noted that the designation report describes Bryant Park as a French Classical style park designed by Lusby Simpson and built in 1934, and reconstructed and partially redesigned by Hanna/Olin in 1988-91. The Commission further noted that Advisory Staff Report 17-7405 was issued on October 5, 2015 for the temporary installation of an ice rink, restaurant and kiosk structures, tents, and light towers in Bryant Park; Advisory Commission Report 13-4440 was issued on July 24, 2012 for the establishment a three year master plan governing the seasonal installations in Bryant Park; Advisory Commission Report 11-8879 was issued April 25, 2011, for installation a deck and pergola;and

Advisory Commission Report 88-0006 was issued January 11, 1988, for installation of restaurant pavilions on rear terrace, kiosks, and paving.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission found that the curatilative impact of these temporary installations will not cause damage to or detract from the significant landscape features of the Bryant Park Scenic Landmark; that these temporary installations will only be installed at the locations specified in the Master Plan, including the lawn, the gravel paths, the allees, the Upper Terroce, the Fountain Terrace on 6th Avenue, the 5th Avenue Terrace in front of the New York Public Library, and a portion of the sidewalk on 42nd Street; that these installations will be of the proposed Installations will not damage the paving, and hardscape surfaces will be protected; that an acceptable plan and time schedule for the dismantling of the seasonal installations will be commission as a component of all future applications; that the proposed variety of installations will be installed on a seasonal basis for less than one year; that in-kind repairs will be made throughout the park at the close of each season, including the restoration of the gravel lawn, replacement of bluestone and grantic puvers, replenishment of the gravel pathways, and any other restoration work, as required; that these seasonal installations will activate this park with both passive and active recreational uses, thereby enhancing the ongoing public function of the Bryant Park Scenic Landmark; and that the proposed Master Plan be limited to a period of ten (10) years, upon which time it will be re-evaluated. Based on these findings, the Commission determined the proposed work to be appropriate to the Bryant Park Scenic Landmark and voted to issue a positive advisory report.

This report is issued on the basis of the building and site conditions described in the application and disclosed during the review process. By accepting this permit, the applicant agrees to notify the Commission if the actual building or site conditions vary or if original or historic building fabric is discovered. The Commission reserves the right to amend or revoke this permit, upon written notice to the applicant, in the event that the actual building or site conditions are materially different from those described in the application or disclosed during the review process.

All approved drawings are marked approved by the Commission with a perforated seal indicating the date of approval. The work is limited to what is contained in the perforated documents. Other work or amendments to this filing must be reviewed and approved separately. 
