



Learn more about this important new addition to our community and tell us what YOU think! Local residents and community stakeholders are invited and encouraged to attend this meeting and participate in the discussion.













EXISTING CONDITIONS – LONG, SKEWED CROSSINGS




EXISTING CONDITIONS – UNCLEAR LANE DESIGNATIONS






EXISTING CONDITIONS – HEAVY TURNS









PROPOSAL – SHORTER CROSSINGS

PROPOSAL SUMMARY

- Paint Curb Extension at Barclay St
- Construct Concrete Island at Vesey St
- Create slip lane from Broadway to Park Row
- Install one thru lane and one left turn lane for westbound Park Row approaching Broadway
- Install one thru lane and one right turn lane approaching Church St

Benefits

- Shorter, more direct crossings
- Reduced pedestrian and vehicular conflicts
- Clear vehicular movements
