



#### CB1 Committee Structure Survey


- 34 Responses out of 47 Members = 72%



#### **Proposed M1 Hotel Zoning Text Amendment**

DCP is proposing a zoning text amendment to establish a CPC Special Permit for new hotels, motels, tourist cabins, and boatels in M1 districts.

 A case-by-case, site-specific review process to ensure that hotels are built only on appropriate sites, minimizing conflicts in industrial areas and achieving a balanced mix of uses in mixed-use areas.

#### **Proposed Special Permit Findings**




## New transient hotels will be permitted by Special Permit when the City Planning Commission finds the following:

- The proposed site plan includes elements that are necessary to address potential conflicts between the hotel and adjacent uses (ex. access, orientation or landscaping).
- The new hotel development will not cause undue vehicular or pedestrian congestion on local streets.
- The proposed new hotel development will not impair the essential character or future use of the surrounding area.




**a.** Traffic violations & non-permissible uses are largely due to the overly wide street.



**c.** Deliveries & loading lack structure, compromise street safety & add to congestion.




**b.** South End Ave traffic issues are most pronounced between Liberty & Albany St.



**d.** On-street parking Demand is a given. How can demand be curbed or discouraged?
















#### iii Site Plan - Bike Network
















#### iii Site Plan - Bike Network

#### How does this impact CB1?

- More buses will travel express from Midtown instead of traveling through lower Manhattan on local streets
- Schedules not finalized but estimated 20% decrease in volume of SI express buses on Downtown local streets
- Working with NYCDOT to establish better staging locations for buses in the evening
- One new route will operate to Downtown off-peak/weekends




