




NORTHERN COURT ROTATED 180°

PRO: Similar arranagment to existing conditions

CONS: 1. People now entering the space in an area where game play is likely to occur.

- 2. Moves area of play closer to the drinking fountain.
- 3. Places the backstop directly in front of the benches
- 4. Increases risk of conflict as players on opposite courts have backs to each other.



NORTHERN COURT ROTATED 180°, BENCHES MOVED TO EAST SIDE

PRO: Similar arranagment to existing conditions

- CONS: 1. People now entering the space in an area where game play is likely to occur.
  - 2. Moves area of play closer to the drinking fountain.
  - Moving benches to the opposite side encourages people to cut across the courts to reach them.
  - 4. Courts no longer align to create room for benches.



Option 2: 31'-10" x 31'-10" (1013.4 SF) LED sign


