





THE UPPER FLOORS OF THIS BUILDING HAVE DOUBLE-HUNG WINDOWS, WHILE THE 2ND FLOOR HAS FULL-HEIGHT PIVOT WINDOWS, MAKING IT HARDER TO INSTALL A SEASONAL AC UNIT. THE CLIENT WANTS TO RESTORE THE FULL-HEIGHT PIVOT WINDOWS AND WANTS THE INSTALLATION TO BE EASILY REVERSIBLE TO CHANGE LOCATIONS WHEN THE ROOFTOP PLAN HAS BEEN CONFIRMED BY THE CO-OP.

WITH PROPOSED (1) CONDENSER, ALL WINDOWS WILL REMAIN ORIGINAL, HISTORIC AND FULL HEIGHT.








100 Hudson Street, Overview Concept of Proposed Work









Access-A-Ride Update

- Too much change and too many unknowns for a resolution at this time.
- Program users do have an option or same day travel taxi reimbursement



Revel Scooter Share



Revel Mopeds

- Revel is an app-based scooter-sharing rental service that costs \$1 per person to unlock and 35 cents/minute of use. Low-income(40%) & military members/veterans (20%) get discounts.
- Mopeds are zero-emissions so help to meet NY Climate Leadership mandate
- The NY State DMV classifies Revel's scooters as Class B limited use motorcycles or mopeds, which requires them to have a license plate, to not be capable of going faster than 30 mph, driver to a valid driver's license and that a helmet be worn.
- Service restarted on August 27, 2020 after the NYC DOT approved its relaunch plan that included training videos, a safety test and photographic evidence of the user(s) wearing a helmet (a selfie)
- Complaints about users' behavior can be made via Revel's app or their website, but not currently via 311

Moped-share in NYC - Resolution

- Mopeds are legal in NY
- NYC Council is working on laws to regulate Moped-share companies and to update the NYC Charter regarding the DOT's responsibilities
- The DOT expects the rule making process for the moped-share industry to begin in 2021 – the DOT has an agreement with Revel regarding their operations.

Int 2159-2020: A Local Law - Resolution

- •§ 19-175.8 Hazardous obstruction.
- •a. No parking, stopping or standing a vehicle (including city vehicles & placards) within a radial distance of 1320 feet of a school building that obstructs a bicycle lane, bus lane, sidewalk, crosswalk or fire hydrant.
- b. Violations have a civil penalty of \$175 (up from \$115) recoverable in a proceeding before the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings.

Int 2159-2020: A Local Law cont'd

- •§ 19-175.9 Civilian complaint of hazardous obstruction.
- a. Any natural person, excluding personnel of the DOT and other employees of the city authorized to serve summonses for violations of section 19-175.8, may file a complaint, in a form prescribed by the commissioner, alleging that a person has violated section 19-175.8.
- b. The DOT shall publish on its website information about filing civilian complaints
- c. A tracking number shall be provided to each person who submits a complaint
- d. The Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings shall award the complainant 25% of any sums collected...
