









Collision Myths

- Bird-window collisions a skyscraper issue
 - Most collisions occur on the lower 200 ft. of buildings
- Birds that fly away after colliding will survive
 - Many die later, unknown long-term effects
 - Please still help injured and stunned birds!
- Collisions happen at night
 - Most collisions happen during the day, when birds are resting and refueling



Collision prevention

Fix glass

- Apply markers in 2x2 pattern on outside of glass
- DON'T use hawk silhouettes or noise deterrents. They do not work.

Reduce Lighting

- Turn off exterior flood lights.
- Turn off lights on unoccupied floors and in unused spaces.
- Opt for shielded lighting that directs lights downward.
- Install automatic motion sensors



Policy: Local Law 15- 2020

- NYC's Bird-Friendly Building Law
- In effect January 2021
- Requires new buildings to be bird friendly to the first 75 feet
- Applied to renovations where the majority of glass is replaced
