





IFPM Lower Manhattan Project Updates


Tribeca Feasibility Analysis

Findings:

- Maximum possible level of protection is 7.5' NAVD88, corresponding to 15-year event
- Majority of buildings in area of protection have own flood protection systems or have a first-floor elevation of above 7.5' NAVD88
- 4 buildings in project area would realize any potential flood risk reduction from IFPM
- 22 estimated residential units in project area
- Unable to rule out groundwater undermining in individual buildings
- Major challenges to deployment including traffic management (West Side Highway closure)


