- · Seven miles of car-free paths for biking, strolling, rollerskating, running, and more, with bike rentals available on the Island from Blazing Saddles and CitiBike
- Sprawling fields for play, with reservations available at govisland.org/permits for schools, teams and leagues
- Playgrounds and recreation for kids and families
- Free exhibits and activities from 24+ NYC nonprofits inside the Island's historic houses in Nolan Park and Colonels Row every Friday-Sunday through October.
- Stunning public art installations by world-renowned artists
- A packed calendar of free concerts, art shows, markets, film screenings, and more, updated regularly online at govisland.org/things-to-do
- Environmental learning at the Urban Farm, open weekends through October
- Digital and in-person tours through the Island's past, present, and future
- A unique history at the Governors Island National Monument, a National Park Service site open weekends Memorial Day-October 29.

GETTING TO GOVERNORS ISLAND

Governors Island is accessible by ferry from Manhattan and Brooklyn year-round. There are two ways to get to Governors Island: Ferries operated by the Trust for Governors Island, and NYC Ferry.



1. Ferries operated by the Trust for Governors Island

Ferries operated by the Trust for Governors Island operate daily from the Battery Maritime Building at 10 South Street in Lower Manhattan and from Brooklyn Bridge Park/Pier 6 and Red Hook/Atlantic Basin on summer weekends May 27-October 29.

IMPORTANT INFO:

- Ferry tickets and schedules available online at govisland.org/ferry or in person at your point of departure
- Reserve free tickets by selecting "Members/Community Groups" and entering the code COMMUNITYPARTNER at checkout
- Ferries operated by the Trust for Governors Island are free for residents of NYCHA housing, children 12 and under, seniors 65
 and over, current and former military servicemembers and anyone with an IDNYC. Round trip ferry tickets cost \$4 for all other
 adults
- Ferries operated by the Trust for Governors Island are free for all riders on weekends before noon

2. NYC Ferry, the city's public ferry service



NYC Ferry provides additional daily service to Governors Island on the South Brooklyn Route, and via shuttle from Wall Street/Pier 11 on summer weekends.

Resolution - Bus stop for Aurora Tourism Services, LLC (dba New York Iconic Cruises)





Therefore Be It Resolved That


Manhattan Community Board 1 supports Aurora Tourism Services LLC's (dba New York Iconic Cruises) request to make four daily (Monday-Sunday) stops for pick ups and drop offs at: 8:00 AM, 10:00 AM, 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM at the requested bus stop across from 100 Broadway as long as:

- Sidewalk crowding does not become a source of common complaints and
- The buses do not cause traffic backup on Broadway to result or worsen.

Be It Further Resolved That

MCB1 implores the New York City (NYC) Department of Transportation (DOT) to consider assigning Aurora Tourism Services to a bus stop on Trinity Place rather on Broadway in order to avoid CB1's concern about adding to the traffic congestion that is already too common on Broadway.

Resolution - Extension of PATH to Newark International Airport



 Extending PATH 2.4 miles from Newark Penn Station to the Northeast Corridor Airport Station would create a single seat 36 minute ride between the WTC and Newark Airport.

 In 2019, it was projected to serve 2.5 millions, growing to 3.6-4.3 million riders over 20 years

District Positions on the PATH Extension Project

- **2009-2019** Economic growth from business and tourism elevated the need for improved international connectivity 2019 Regional Plan Association (RPA) report
- **2014** CB1 testified for one-seat airport access; stated this request had been made for over a decade
- **2016** CB1 made a district budget request for one-seat rides to airports
- **2019** Downtown-Lower Manhattan Association supported quick, reliable access to Newark International Airport (EWR)
- March 16, 2023 a Downtown Alliance adds a post about the need for the PATH Extension Project

Therefore Be It Resolved That

Manhattan Community Board 1 (MCB1) shares the Downtown Alliance's concern about yet another pause in creating a one seat ride between the World Trade Center PATH station in Lower Manhattan and Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR); and

Be It Further Resolved That

MCB1 implores:

- Governor Kathy Hochul to work with the New York New Jersey Port Authority (NYNJPA) to reactivate the Port Authority Trans-Hudson (PATH) Extension Project so to seamlessly connect Lower Manhattan and Midtown to Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR);
- Our New York State elected officials to work with the governor to get this project restarted; and
- Congressman Dan Goldman, Senator Chuck Schumer, Senator Kirsten Gillibrand and federal transportation officials to help identify and secure federal funds that can be used to connect Lower Manhattan and Midtown to Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR) via the Port Authority Trans-Hudson (PATH) train.



SAPO Request for an Event on a Single Street

- How applicant will encourage and provide information about mass transportation options including: subway, bus, PATH train, ferry, Staten Island ferry and Citi bike locations that are closest and a short walk;
- Suggested locations where participants using for-hire or private vehicles can be dropped off or picked up;
- Parking information, including secure parking, for privately owned bikes and e-scooters;
- Opening and closing times for the road(s) to be used for a requested street activity.
- Pedestrian and cyclist access to the street (especially sidewalks and crosswalks) during the street closure, as well as, during any event activities;
- Plan for notifying block residents and businesses in advance of the permitted event;
- Plan for posting notification signs about the pending closure and activity as well as a contact(s) for inquiries from the public in advance and during the event; and

SAPO Request for an Event on a Single Street cont'd

Other issues:

- Bathroom access including the location, signage to direct participants and the available facilities (number of toilets, accessibility, changing tables, gender designation, etc); and
- Security plan, during the event, if someone will facilitate the movement of participants at the event's start and finish; and
- Any need or plans for amplified sound (times, volume, locations of speakers, reason for their use); and
- Access to water, shade, seating, etc. for participants that are planned; and Inclement weather plans.
