

Stakeholder Issues

Washington Market School:

- Their need and uses for having a closed Open Street on Staple Street have evolved since 2020. WMS now plans to use it a "handful of times" for special events
- Wants to maintain a good relationship with their neighbors on Staple Street
- Willing to work with DOT to see if application can be modified to reflect the limited use that is planned - or- if necessary work with SAPO

Residents & Businesses on the block:


- Many residents work at home and find voices of children playing to be distracting, especially if on a daily basis
- No main entrances, but is only accessible entrance for at least one building + doors used by other buildings for deliveries, moving items and trash
- Film industry work on weekends further limits resident's access to their street

Therefore Be It Resolved That:

Manhattan Community Board 1 opposes Washington Market School's (WMS) request for a year around, Full Closure, School Open Street on Staple Street between Duane and Jay Streets. However, WMS is encouraged to work with their neighbors, the NYC Department of Transportation (DOT) and the Street Activity Permit Office (SAPO), if appropriate, to develop a plan that better meets everyone's needs.

Positions at Committee Discussion

PRO (in support of the request and plan):

- Protecting pedestrians required that protective structures be placed near the curb line around the property - not be restricted by the BNY Mellon property line
- Given the level of security approved by the NYPD & that the bank was urged to install, bollards used the least space and allowed the most pedestrian circulation.
 Preferred over a "wall" of planters hiding bollards
- Bollards not visually offensive, typical of area & better use of space

CON (not is support of the request and plan):

- Area around BNY Mellon already contains too many blocks surrounded by bollards for security purposes - feels like a jail vs neighborhood
- Jan 2021 resolution called for security plan that used plantings within the property line versus use of the right of way.

Therefore Be It Resolved That:

Manhattan Community Board 1 (MCB1) supports a revocable consent for Bank of New York Mellon (BNY) at 240 Greenwich Street if:

- Accessible, protected pedestrian paths and access to all buildings and streets are available throughout the period of construction around the entire property, which is bordered by West (Rt 9A), Murray, Greenwich and Barclay Streets; and
- A community liaison is identified and a phone number is made available to the public so that real time concerns and questions can be communicated and responded to; and
- Outreach is done to inform citizens and neighboring buildings in advance of what and when work will be performed; and
- Noisy work including jackhammering does not occur before 8:00 AM; and
- The applicant works with the DOT and Citi Bike to encourage them to maintain a Citi Bike station on the roadbed, somewhere around the building throughout and at the end of construction.
