





MCB1 Complaint Map





Leading causes of complaints for MCB1







Update on Proposal for Protected Bicycle Lanes

Presented to Community Board 1 on September 3, 2025



Support for Adjusted Brooklyn Bridge Bike Lane Improvements Project

TBIRT: CB1 supports the proposed near-term changes in the Brooklyn Bridge Lane Improvement Project (at Centre Street). However, CB1 urges the City of New York (NYC) Department of Transportation (DOT) to plan for a capital project, as soon as possible, so that a comprehensive restructuring of the area, versus what can be achieved with paint and temporary installations, can be planned and constructed; and

TBIFRT: CB1 requests that the DOT study the viability and options for moving the Citi bike station on Centre Street by City Hall Park to the curb lane, or the curb line facing the street, to discourage riding these bikes on the sidewalk to/from the station.

Request for a capital improvement project for Centre Street from Chambers Street to City Hall Park

TBIRT: CB1 urges the NYC Department of Transportation to initiate a capital improvements project for Centre Street, from Chambers Street to at least City Hall Park and the Park Row bike lane. This project must place pedestrians at the forefront while maximizing safety, maintaining capacity, allowing efficient movement for all modes of transportation, and reducing conflicts so that this critical civic corridor reflects both its importance and the needs of all who use it.
