
## New York City Health and Nutrition Examination Survey

Find out your cholesterol level, how well your kidneys are functioning, whether you have diabetes, and whether you've been exposed to lead or mercury. Our friendly, trained staff will come to your home to conduct a brief physical exam. Or you may prefer to go to a clinic in Lower Manhattan. We'll provide some results on the spot, such as blood pressure and body mass index, and mail others if they're normal. If abnormal, we'll contact you more quickly and provide referrals to free and low-cost care.




You don't even have to leave home to participate. We prefer that you take the survey and a brief physical exam together. You may do this during the day, in the evening or on weekends. We don't ask or care about your immigration status, and we'll keep your health information confidential unless we're required by public health law to report it. If you participate in all parts of the study—which you can do in less time than it takes to go to a movie—we'll leave you with an extra \$100 bill in your pocket.


