






Population Growth in CB1 (2000 - 2010)




Population Change in CB1 Neighborhoods (2000 - 2010)




Population Percentage Change in CB1 Neighborhoods (2000 - 2010)




CB 1 Population Distribution by Neighborhood (2000 - 2010)



346 BROADWAY COMMUNITY SPACE ORIGINAL PROPOSAL (EXHIBIT A)


















