PLEASE NOTE:

Community Board 3 requests that Sidewalk Cafés cease operation no later than midnight on weekends and 11 p.m. on weekdays. We urge you to consider closing at 11 p.m. and 10 p.m. respectively. Unenclosed sidewalks cafés (railings, chairs, and tables) must be removable and put away at the end of each night. Until you receive your license from the city, you are not licensed to operate your sidewalk café and may be fined for doing so.

For full regulations governing sidewalk cafés, please consult the City Code, Article 1, Chapter 4, Sections 14-11 through 14-43. (Available from the Department of Consumer Affairs.)

To the Esteemed Members of Community Board Number 3,

We apologize for not being present to submit this statement in person, but we have given this letter to the owners of Sel Rose to read on our behalf.

We are a married couple living at 153 Bowery, and have occupied and owned our unit for the last 6 years. We are employed in the finance and publishing industries, and are in our early 40's/50's, and like most New Yorkers, we are overly consumed in our careers, and are extremely busy. We are writing because we feel strongly and want you to know how we feel. We have seen our neighborhood slowly change over time, and we welcome the change we see. Over the 6 years of living here, we see the neighborhood becoming safer and cleaner. We see a lesser incidence of graffiti, and a greater effort to combat graffiti. We see more bars, restaurants, and cafes coming into the area, and with that, safety, cleanliness, and upkeep are all on the rise. We attribute these positive changes to the greater incidence of such establishments.

You may remember that we last wrote to support the approval for an alcohol license for Sel Rose in 2012. We are pleased to write to you again, to let you know that this new establishment is a gem, and one that should be given permission to expand into a sidewalk summertime café. We have seen the owners of Sel Rose manage their business in an orderly way, and one that adds value to our community. As we stated in our letter in 2012, the owners of Sel Rose own another establishment nearby, and take pride in hiring excellent staff, and ensuring that any outdoor crowds are supervised, including smokers and entrance lines in their other establishment nearby. We can attest to the fact that Sel Rose is maintained in a similar fashion, and also that their portions of sidewalks were extremely well maintained during the harsh winter. Likewise, they are dutiful with respect to cleanliness of the sidewalk for any trash generated by crowds or their operations. The general condition of the actual pavement has also improved with their establishment and continued operations...something we very much appreciate.

As people who walk our dogs past both Home Sweet Home and Sel Rose each night, and have for years, we would like to express unwavering support to the expansion into a sidewalk café. We are glad to have the extra presence at night on the street, as we know it will help further decrease graffiti occurrences, and it will increase safety at night. The sidewalk where they are planning to expand is quite large and will easily sustain the extra foot traffic. The busy streets next to them (Bowery and Delancy) leave ample room for any noise to diffuse, and honestly, walking by each night, we have never witnessed any

noise issues. The establishment and the patrons are actually very low key and relatively quiet. We are pleased to see their proposal and hope they will be very successful.

As we stated in our prior letter, we do not personally know the owners of Home Sweet Home or Sel Rose, nor do we frequent their establishments due to a lack of leisure time. However, we witness the quality and care with which they hire staff, train, and manage their operations, and we are impressed with such. We sincerely hope that you will consider their application for a sidewalk café expansion, and approve it without hesitation.


