As we all know, the nightlife industry has been decimated by the pandemic. Those of us that are still hanging on are trying to find new and safer ways to operate. Over the past 9 months I've watched countless health experts give advice on how we should be living our lives. We've all heard their recommendations. Being socially distant and outside is the best case scenario.

Here at the Parkside we've added some outdoor seating on Houston street but the minimal amount of customers we can serve doesn't come close to allowing us to do a necessary volume of sales. On top of that, our little corner isn't the safest place to enjoy a cocktail. We're constantly working with the police, neighbors, and local businesses trying to keep our customers safe.


Having run the Parkside for over a decade I've spent plenty of time on our roof. Usually I'm just up there to cover graffiti or clean up after one of my neighbor's parties that they've thrown. Interestingly enough, according to Community Affairs at the 7th precinct, I can't prevent them from going on my roof but I'm still liable if someone were to get hurt.

I've spent the entirety of 2020 since March trying to keep my business afloat. Between the small service area and the constant possibility of violence on Houston street, The Parkside needs to expand in a socially distant, outdoor, and safer way. Adding a roof deck for seating for customers is a solution to many of our problems and could put a silver lining on a miserable year for our historic venue. I've met with a contractor and gotten an estimate as well as a timetable for the work.

Over the decades I've worked closely with my immediate neighbors and have already received their blessing. The next step is to bring this to the larger community for approval.
