
She has repeatedly responded on a timely basis to my emails, has honored her commitment to have an ice cream table at our events, even where other, potentially,

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




FRONT ELEVATION 207 Bowery New York, NY September 21, 2023


INTERIOR DIAGRAM — 1st Floor 207 Bowery New York, NY September 21, 2023
