#### **HHS Accelerator Sunset**

MOCS will officially decommission HHS Accelerator on Wednesday, July 31, 2024. Remember to download your documents before the system sunsets.

With the upcoming new release and the decommissioning of HHS Accelerator, it is important that you download documents from the HHSA Document Vault that do not meet the specified criteria below:

- Documents linked to contracts with a fiscal year 2021 or later budget that have an open balance.
- Documents linked to contracts with a future contract end date.

We are excited to introduce **PASS***Port* **Vault** and the **Subcontractor Module** as part of our next PASS*Port* Release coming late Summer 2024.

#### PASSPort Vault

Designed for transparency and collaboration, the new PASS*Port* Vault stores and manages specific document types, enabling you to access proposals, contracts and/or PQL applications at a moment's notice. Remember, documents in the vault are subject to FOIL requests.

#### **Subcontractor Management**

Designed to streamline the subcontractor approval and payment process, PASS*Port* will provide increased transparency and interaction with agencies.

### Get M/WBE Certified Today!

Are you a Minority or Women-owed business? Want to know how to find new opportunities for doing business with the NYC?

City agencies can award contracts of up to \$1,500,000 for goods, services, and construction directly to City-certified M/WBEs without formal competition by using the M/WBE Noncompetitive Small Purchase Method.

This process makes it easier for the City to do business with M/WBEs.

The NYC standard human service contract does not allow anyone to have a job with a contractor where an immediate family member has authority over them.
