

MOERJ brought together city agencies for the official, NYC Citywide Racial Equity Planning process, where city staffers engaged in training focused on eliminating racial disparities and fostering fairness for all residents.

In 2024, the NYC Commission on Gender Equity (CGE) increased their community engagement work by enhancing their digital and social media presence, tabling at over 40 public events to share resources with New Yorkers, and publishing resource guides on city services. CGE also advanced its programmatic and policy work by hosting public meetings to help improve NYC's child care ecosystem and combat street harassment.



MOERJ proudly partnered with the New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) to invest nearly \$900,000 to expand its Family Self-Sufficiency, Food Business Pathways, and NYCHA Resident Training Academy programs to create lasting opportunities for growth and economic advancement in Bronx communities across the borough.

YMI spent the year connecting with youth across all five boroughs through career days, competitions, networking events, and performances. YMI also expanded its literacy programs, empowering countless students towards academic success.



In partnership with the McSilver Institute for Poverty Policy and Research at New York University, we joined state and city officials, practitioners, and researchers for panel discussions on Black maternal health in New York. This important conversation not only explored existing legislation and identified key areas of need but also offered a space for sharing personal experiences and finding inspiration toward a better path forward.

By highlighting upcoming legislative priorities and hearing first-hand accounts, we deepened our understanding of the challenges and opportunities ahead.
