MS. CONOVITZ: I have some questions.

MR. HATCH: All right.

MS. CONOVITZ: This is going to be addressed to Parks. We have a number of questions and I'll get to them. But first, in the connection with corporate structure and vendor responsibility; the vendor and the principle questionnaire is filed by Statue Cruises and a parent company, legal aid is required to disclose principle owners and affidavits.

We'dlike you to clarify statues in corporate structure in relationship to Hornblower Holding, LLC and it's subsidiaries and its principle owner, Terry MacRae, and quite way of example, we just want to note that Statue Cruises and a recent passport vendor submission originally listed Hornblower Holding as an affiliate. And then in its 2007 proposal for this concession Statue Cruises, LLC identified Hornblower

2.1

Yachts, Inc. as its parent company in the city vendor exchange system. And on Hornblower's website, hornblower.com, Statue is listed as a concession. And finally, in a different recent proposal for Parks and Concession's Hornblower Holding, also disclosed an extensive list of relevant subs, now, uber by way of example, but I want to go back to that original question about structure.

MR. HAN: Sure. To our best understanding Statue Cruises, LLC is a subsidiary of Liberty Cruises, LLC which is a subsidiary of Hornblower Group, Inc.

MS. CONOVITZ: And there is a no further clarification about various inconsistencies that may have been documented, or other things that you have learned since?

MR. HAN: As I understand it, last week Statue Cruises, LLC had signed into the passport to clarify and revise any inconsistencies. And you know, to our

best understanding, the passenger files are correct and it reflects the statement that I just made in terms of corporate structure.

MS. CONOVITZ: HNY Ferry appears to be related to an affiliate of Hornblower, which operates the New York ferries that had an incident, with the Sanborn on 11/27/17; and he probably had six other ferries decommissioned due to leaks. The news reports indicate that the US Coast Guard is also investigating

the incident.

The Parks responsibility

determination doesn't address the above safety incident either, or ferry decommissioning, or the ongoing Coast Guard investigation. And it does not indicate Statue Cruises operation of different boats, or incidents for performance record, or incorporation of any safety precautions.

Can you explain why that's not in the responsibility determination?

MR. HAN: Parks is unaware of misconduct or any safety issues regarding Statue Cruises, or it's operations. All Statue Cruises vessels are inspected by the US Coast Guard annually, as required. Statue Cruises has provided parts of the information for the safety of the operations and maintenance of their vessels.

MS. CONOVITZ: So you do not think it's relevant for the ordeal?

MR. HAN: No.

MS. CONOVITZ: And now, I just want to talk about the legal agreements and some of the provisions that we just had questions on.

It would seem appropriate, under the circumstances, for this committee to review any renewal options at a later date.

No. 1: IN THE MATTER of the intent to seek Franchise and Concession Review Committee approval to utilize a different procedure, pursuant to Section 1-16 of the Concession Rules of the City of New York, to authorize the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation (Parks) to enter into an amendment to the existing license agreement between Parks and Statue Cruises, LLC ("Licensee") for the operation of three landing slips at The Battery for the purposes of embarking and discharging passengers on a regular schedule in the operation of passenger ferries between The Battery and Liberty and Ellis Islands, embarking and discharging passengers of vessels on sightseeing cruises and other ferry operations, which may include but are not limited to ferry service to Governors Island, and day and night charters of vessels, owned, operated or chartered by Licensee. The amendment, among other things, extends the agreement through September 30, 2019; with two (2) one (1)-year renewal options to be exercised at the sole discretion of Parks. Compensation to the City will be as follows: Licensee shall pay to the City license fees consisting of the greater of a guaranteed minimum annual fee versus a percentage of gross receipts. (January 1, 2018 – December 31, 2018): \$2,500,000 vs. 8.5%; (January 1, 2019 – September 30, 2019): \$1,875,000 vs. 8.5%; First Option Year (October 1, 2019 – September 30, 2020): \$2,500,000 vs. 8.5%; Second Option Year (October 1, 2020 – September 30, 2021): \$2,500,000 vs. 8.5%.
