22	Source License Agreement with Bryant
23	Park Corp. in Manhattan that will cover
24	a variety of revenue-generating
25	activities that all New Yorkers can

1 enjoy throughout the year. These activities include the operation of the 2 3 Bryant Park Restaurant, food concessions, a carousel, and an 4 5 ice-skating rink, among many others. The City's current agreement with 6 BPC has been in effect since 1985. 7 Under that agreement, BPC retains all 8 9 revenue streams that are produced by the 10 concessions, special events, and 11 sponsorships in order to fund operating 12 expenses. 13 As we have previously stated, as the 14 fiscal officer of the City, the 15 Comptroller's Office would like to work with the Parks Department to develop a 16 17 consistent policy regarding when and to 18 what extent concession agreements should 19 permit excess revenues to be used in the 20 local community, and when and to what 21 extent such agreements should require 22 that excess revenues are remitted to the 23 general fund. In light of the successes of Bryant 24 Park, the Comptroller's Office asks 25

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Parks to include a provision in the proposed license agreement that would require excess revenues to revert back to the City's general fund. Excess revenues may be defined to allow BPC to provide certain services above and beyond those required under its Maintenance and Operation Agreement with the Parks Department.

In addition, we request that Parks provide a comprehensive list of all concessions in Bryant Park. Such lists should include the revenues generated and expenses incurred in past fiscal years, a projection of the same for the term of the agreement, and any other relevant information.

Finally, we renew our call for Bryant Park to fully comply with the recommendation of our office's June 30, 2016 audit report. Thank you. MR. HATCH: Are there members that

IN THE MATTER of the intent to seek Franchise and Concession Review No. 1: Committee approval to utilize a different procedure, pursuant to Section 1-16 of the Concession Rules of the City of New York, to authorize the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation (Parks) to enter into an amendment to the existing license agreement between Parks and Statue Cruises, LLC ("Licensee") for the operation of three landing slips at The Battery for the purposes of embarking and discharging passengers on a regular schedule in the operation of passenger ferries between The Battery and Liberty and Ellis Islands, embarking and discharging passengers of vessels on sightseeing cruises and other ferry operations, which may include but are not limited to ferry service to Governors Island, and day and night charters of vessels, owned, operated or chartered by Licensee. The amendment, among other things, extends the agreement through September 30, 2019; with two (2) one (1)-year renewal options to be exercised at the sole discretion of Parks. Compensation to the City will be as follows: Licensee shall pay to the City license fees consisting of the greater of a guaranteed minimum annual fee versus a percentage of gross receipts. (January 1, 2018 – December 31, 2018): \$2,500,000 vs. 8.5%; (January 1, 2019 – September 30, 2019): \$1,875,000 vs. 8.5%; First Option Year (October 1, 2019 - September 30, 2020): \$2,500,000 vs. 8.5%; Second Option Year (October 1, 2020 -September 30, 2021): \$2,500,000 vs. 8.5%.
