1 submissions must be given to the Clerk 2 before the close of the public hearing. 3 Will the Clerk please call the first calendar item? 4 5 THE CLERK: New York City Department of Parks and Recreation, Calendar Item 6 number 1: In the matter of intent to 7 award as a concession for the 8 9 development, operation and maintenance 10 of a food service facility, and the 11 operation of two mobile food units, at 12 McCarren Park, Brooklyn, New York, for a 20 year term, to McCarren Park House 13 14 LLC. 15 Please be advised that at the 16 request of the agency, this item will be 17 held over to the February 11, 2019 FCRC 18 Public Hearing, which will take place in 19 the 14th Floor Auditorium of 2 Lafayette 20 Street, Manhattan at 2:30 p.m. 21 Any changes in the schedule, which 22 will result in a Public Hearing being 23 scheduled prior to the February 11th 24 FCRC Public Hearing, will be reflected 25 in the City Record and the newspapers as

required by Section 371 of the New York 1 2 City Charter. MR. HATCH: Although this item has 3 been held over, we'll take any 4 statements from members of the Committee 5 or the public. 6 7 (No response.) MR. HATCH: If no one wishes to 8 9 speak, the hearing on the first calendar item will be continued to the February 10 11 FCRC Public Hearing. 12 Will the Clerk please call the 13 second calendar item? 14 THE CLERK: New York City Department 15 of Parks and Recreation, Calendar Item number 2: In the matter of intent to 16 17 award as a concession for the 18 development, operation and maintenance 19 of a year-round tennis or sports 20 facility at Willowbrook Park, Staten 21 Island, for a 20 year term, to McCarren 22 Tennis Center Partners, LLC. 23 MR. HATCH: Are there any members of the Committee that wish to make a 24 25 statement?

1 MS. CONOVITZ: Actually, just a 2 couple of questions for Parks. 3 The first, could Parks just let us know whether or not there are currently 4 5 tennis -- ongoing tennis activities at this site? 6 MR. HAN: No, there are not. 7 MS. CONOVITZ: And have there been 8 9 in the past? 10 MR. HAN: Years ago, yes. 11 MS. CONOVITZ: And could you just 12 give us a bit of an overview of the work 13 that's going to be done at this site? MR. HAN: Sure. The concession 14 15 calls for the renovation of the existing 16 six courts, the construction of two 17 additional courts, a clubhouse, and an 18 enclosure, along with other improvements 19 as outlined in Exhibit D of the License 20 Draft. 21 MS. CONOVITZ: And that's extensive 22 capital commitment? 23 MR. HAN: Yes, the amount -- the 24 minimum capital expenditure requirement is 1.82 million. 25

MS. CONOVITZ: And could you give us 1 a sense of how this differs from the 2 operations that are in McCarren Park in 3 Brooklyn that the proposed concession 4 5 there operates? MR. HAN: Well, a lot of it is 6 really speculation. I don't think we 7 can compare the two operations because 8 they're very different. 9 We've never had a concession 10 11 providing indoor tennis on Staten Island 12 before, and so there is a level of risk 13 that we're all assuming. But the courts do need the 14 15 renovations. There's only one indoor 16 tennis facility on Staten Island that 17 we're aware of, and so this will be the first ever venture for Parks and our 18 19 concession on the island. 20 MS. CONOVITZ: Thank you. 21 MR. HATCH: Will the Clerk confirm 22 there are no members of the public who 23 wish testify on this item? 24 THE CLERK: Confirmed. MR. HATCH: Then that concludes the 25

hearing on the second calendar item. 1 Will the Clerk please call the third 2 calendar item? 3 THE CLERK: New York City Department 4 of Parks and Recreation, Calendar Item 5 number 3: In the matter of intent to 6 award as a concession for the 7 renovation, operation and maintenance of 8 a snack bar at the Heckscher Ballfields 9 in Central Park, Manhattan, New York, 10 11 for a nine year term with a six month 12 renewal option exercisable at Parks' 13 sole discretion, to Panda Bubble Tea CP LLC. 14 15 MR. HATCH: Any members of the 16 Committee wish to make a statement or 17 ask a question? 18 (No response.) 19 MR. HATCH: Any members of the 20 public? 21 (No response.) MR.
