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THE CHAIR: Will the Clerk please call the third calendar item?

THE CLERK: New York City Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications, Calendar Item Number 3: In the matter of the intent to seek Franchise and Concession Review Committee approval regarding a proposed amendment to a cable franchise agreement between the City of New York and Verizon New York, Inc. that will, among other things; 1, extend the term of the agreement for an additional three years; 2, require deployment of cable service at a minimum of 500,000 residential dwelling units not previously eligible for standard installation, with at least 125,000 of such units being in certain currently underserved community districts; and 3, require deployment of cable service to New York City Housing Authority residential dwelling units not previously eligible for cable service, pursuant to schedules in the amendment.

THE CHAIR: Is there a member who wishes to make a statement or ask a question

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on this matter?

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MS. CANTLO: This is Tonya Cantlo from the Brooklyn Borough President's office. have a statement on behalf of the Borough President.

It is taking way too long to close our digital divide. Everyday New Yorkers cannot understand how we are well into the 21st century, while still depending on 20th century infrastructure. Government has not exercised its full franchising and regulatory power to deliver on this most fundamental promise, and aspiring internet providers have not sufficiently stepped up to the plate to bridge communities that have been left behind. We must be clear that high-speed, high-quality broadband access is not a luxury good but a necessity for remote learning, working from home, and even getting an appointment for COVID-19 vaccine.

Three months ago, in response to startling revelations of our city's failure to ensure that every student can log into their classrooms and learn, particularly

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those in shelters and temporary housing, I called on our major technology and internet providers to go further in their community benefits, including free broadband and wireless service for all students in need. I declared my intent to vote against any FCRC Franchise Renewal that lacked a firm timetable to close the digital divide and commitment to greater assistance for families struggling to connect to remote learning. I communicated that intent in a subsequent letter to our current internet franchisees, and that intent was repeated at an FCRC meeting a couple of days ago.

Unfortunately, while a recent agreement with Verizon led to an announced expansion of its broadband footprint, the moment we face demands that they and all perspective franchisees present a far more significant build-out plan that has yet to be put forward. A real recovery for our city demands higher standards from all of us.

Because of this, as well as unresolved concerns for protecting the public access

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programming of the organizations like BRIC,
BronxNet, and Manhattan Neighborhood Network,
MNN, I will not support this franchise
renewal at this time. I hope that this sends
a clear message on behalf of all New Yorkers
who expects more. It is time for true
universal internet guaranteed.

That concludes my statement on behalf of the Brooklyn Borough President.

THE CHAIR: Thank you. I believe there is another member who would like to make a statement or ask a question.

MR. KATSORHIS: Yes, I have a statement on behalf of the Comptroller.

This franchise amendment goes a long way towards serving previously underserved communities, including NYCHA residents. For that reason, Comptroller Stringer strongly apports the continuation of that work, and I am therefore voting in favor of the agreement. However, we must start working towards the next agreement to ensure the necessary investments in our community access organizations. The CAOs provide essential

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education, cultural and news programming and services to New Yorkers across the five boroughs.

Under this amendment, they will continue their critical work for another three years without increased support for capital and operating funds. In fact, operating funds have decreased sharply as cable companies move subscribers from cable TV to broadband for services that does not require cable companies to pay a fee to the City. Fewer cable TV subscribers means less revenue for the City and for the CAOs. The shift in subscriber trends will need to be thoroughly addressed in future agreements.

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CAOs have stepped up during the pandemic to serve communities in even more ways and they must therefore be central in the discussion for the next franchise agreement, as well as in other conversations about how to adjust the public right-of-way fees to ensure fair and equitable path for

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the future. Thank you.

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Thank you. THE CHAIR: Is there any

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other member who wishes to make a statement or ask a question on this matter?

MR. SWISHER: This is Allan Swisher from the Queens Borough President's office.

I'll just note that I have submitted a written statement for the record. It does echo several of the points that my colleagues have made here at the FCRC meeting today.

The Queens Borough President Donavon Richard is in support of this agreement today because of the efforts that it would make to close the digital divide that currently plagues so many people in Queens and in the City of New York. I do think that it's important for us to point out that this agreement was reached after Verizon previously had failed to live up to the terms of its agreement. So, it is incumbent upon all of us to ensure that they, in fact, do satisfy the terms of this agreement moving forward.

I also want to point out, as my colleagues have, that this renewed agreement doesn't include increased funding for cable

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access organizations. And we would hope that DOITT, the Mayor's Office, and my colleagues here would keep that in mind as we consider agreements moving forward. But with those caveats, we are in support of the amendments under consideration today.

THE CHAIR: Thank you. Is there any other member who wishes to make a statement or ask a question on this matter?

MS. SABIO: Yes. This is Mirtha

Camille Sabio for the Bronx Borough

President. I do want to make a brief

statement to dovetail what my colleagues have said and put on the table, but also just to put our statement into the record.

Our most vulnerable communities have long been overlooked when it comes to providing equal access to internet and cable services. Nothing has made this digital divide more plain than the onset of this pandemic, which resulted in the closing of schools and work, and which dramatically changed the way we all work, learn, and live.

Today's action to extend the Verizon

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franchise, which will provide much-needed cable service to over a half million households and immediately outfits certain NYCHA developments on a schedule with the technological capabilities that they need and have been so desperately lacking in, is certainly a step in the right direction, no matter how belated it may be.

The City must not, however, let this be the first and only step. Swift action should be taken to provide this critical access to all underserved communities in all boroughs and all NYCHA developments throughout our great city. We must also look to better support our cable access organizations, as my colleague said, which serves as a lifeline of news, programming, critical information throughout all of these same communities.

Extending technological options to our urban deserts is a priority that must remain at the forefront of our collective minds.
