farmers markets and winter-holiday markets that 1 do not materially displace other public-park 2 3 uses and are limited in duration to a few weeks per year (or, in the case of farmers markets, a 4 5 few days per week), and other such similar uses as may be approved in advance by "Parks." 6 Under the license agreement, "Parks" also 7 grants Hudson Yards/Hell's Kitchen BID the 8 right to receive the fees generated by certain 9 10 third-party events (no more than 12 times per 11 year and twice per month). In lieu of a license fee, Hudson 12 Yards/Hell's Kitchen BID will use all gross 13 receipts received by it from or in connection 14 15 with its operations at the licensed premises exclusively to provide for the management, 16 17 maintenance, operation, and programming of Hudson Boulevard Park, in accordance with the 18 19 terms of the M&O agreement (as defined in the 20 license agreement) and as otherwise set forth 21 in this license agreement. 22 A proposed resolution was submitted 23 relative thereto, and the resolution was calendared for adoption. 24 25 I believe that a member would like CHAIR:

1 to make a statement on this matter. 2 Comptroller? 3 MS. CONOVITZ: Thank you. We would like to highlight that an 4 5 agreement covering many of the obligations for maintenance and operations for Hudson Park was 6 completed between Hudson Yards/Hell's Kitchen 7 8 BID (also known as the Hudson Yards/Hell's 9 Kitchen Alliance) and "Parks" in 2015. 10 This agreement contemplated that a 11 concession agreement between the BID and "Parks" would be negotiated at a later date, 12 which leads us to the concession agreement 13 14 before us today. In this instance, the terms of the 2015 15 agreement between "Parks" and the BID require 16 17 that any revenue must be used to carry out 18 services in the park. As a general matter, we continue to 19 20 believe that the City should develop a policy 21 regarding when and under what circumstances the 22 concession agreement should permit excess 23 revenues to be used in the local community. We also note that with respect to tracking 24 25 and transparency, among other things, the BID

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1 separately tracks and reports revenues and 2 expenditures related to the park as distinct from those for the rest of the BID area. 3 As a further best practice, the BID will 4 5 maintain a separate bank account for the moneys derived from the revenue generated from 6 7 activities in Hudson Park. 8 Thank you. 9 CHAIR: Are there any other members that 10 wish to make a statement on this item? A proposed resolution was submitted 15 relative thereto, and the resolution is 16 17 calendared for adoption. Is there a member that wishes to 18 CHATR: make a statement on this matter? 19 20 Recognizing the Comptroller. 21 MS. CONOVITZ: Thank you. 22 Um, we also would like to thank the Parks 23 Department for working to provide us with information concerning the extraordinary 24 25 circumstances of this project, which includes

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among other things, an anticipated, significant expansion and renovation of the current tennis facilities on Randall's Island, new courts optimal for new players under 10 or those with limited mobility in addition to multiple enhancements to one or more existing parks.

We would like to note our expectation that the "Parks" will keep in mind the benefits to the community as it negotiates this agreement, for instance, among other things: the increased community programming for local youth, increased scholarship programs for students as well as improved and increased access for members of the public, who hold New York City tennis permits.

We also understand and expect that as "Parks" negotiates this agreement, it will take into account anticipated increase in court inventory, and it will negotiate appropriate compensation to the City.

Furthermore, the Comptroller's Office understands that construction is expected to take between 18 and 24 months, which will be phased in, in order to create as little disruption and inconvenience to the public as

1 possible. 2 In light of this, the Comptroller's Office 3 suggests that "Parks" negotiate appropriate compensation to the City in the event that 4 5 construction results in more than minimal disruption or inconvenience to the public or 6 7 results in the decrease in concession revenue. 8 CHAIR: Any other members? 9 Then, if not, will a member please make a 10 motion to move the item? MS. CANTOR: So moved. 11 12 Will another member please second that 13 motion? 14 MR.
