1 THE CLERK: Hello, this is Gregg 2 Alleyne, clerk for the FCRC. Before we 3 get started with today's proceedings, 4 I'd like to confirm that everyone can 5 6 hear me clearly. (Chorus of "Yeses.") 7 THE CLERK: Today's meeting is being 8 9 held via Microsoft Teams conference call 10 and we ask that all attendees announce 11 their name for the record each time they speak on the call, for ease of 12 13 transcription. If you are not speaking, 14 we ask that you mute your microphone to avoid background noises during the call. 15 16 Only one person should be speaking at 17 any given time. I will direct, should there be any conflict. 18 Chair, we are ready to begin. 19 20 CHAIR CHIU: Good afternoon, and 21 thank you all for being here. My name 22 is Bess Chiu, Chair for the FCRC. The Franchise and Concession Review 23 24 Committee remote public meeting will now 25 come to order.

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1 2 Will the Clerk please call the roll. 3 THE CLERK: Mayor? 4 CHAIR CHIU: Bess Chiu, here. THE CLERK: Office of the Mayor? 5 6 MS. BERO: Julie Bero, present. 7 THE CLERK: Comptroller? 8 MR. KATSORHIS: John Katsorhis, 9 here. THE CLERK: Corporation Counsel? 10 11 MS. CANTOR: Sharon Cantor, present 12 for Calendar Item 1. 13 MS. BARTH: Amrita Barth, present 14 for Calendar Item 2. THE CLERK: Office of Management and 15 16 Budget. 17 MS. QUINTIAN: Yvonne Quintian, 18 present. 19 THE CLERK: President, Borough of 20 the Bronx? 21 MS. CHAIR CHIU: Will the clerk please 15 call the first calendar item? 16 THE CLERK: New York City Department 17 of Parks and Recreation, Calendar Item 18 No.1: In the matter of the intent to 19 seek Franchise and Concession Review 2.0 21 Committee approval to utilize a 22 different procedure, pursuant to Section 23 1-16 of the Concession Rules of the City 24 of New York, to negotiate a Sole Source 25 License Agreement with Statue Cruises,

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1 LLC for the operation and maintenance of 2 two passenger ferries for the purpose of 3 embarking and discharging passengers on 4 a regular schedule between The Battery, 5 Liberty Island, and Ellis Island, and 6 7 for the purpose of embarking and discharging passengers of vessels on 8 9 sightseeing cruises and other ferry 10 operations, which may include but are 11 not limited to, day and night charters of vessels, owned, operated or chartered 12 13 by Statue Cruises, LLC at landing slips 14 and adjacent walkways located in The Battery, Manhattan. 15 16 CHAIR CHIU: Is there a member who wishes to make a statement or ask a 17 18 question on this matter? 19 (No response was given.) CHAIR CHIU: If not, will a member 2.0 21 please make a motion to move this item? 22 MS. CANTOR: Sharon Cantor, I move 23 the item. 24 CHAIR CHIU: Will another member 25 please second the motion?

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1 2 MS. BERO: Julie Bero, so moved. 3 CHAIR CHIU: Will the clerk please 4 take the vote? 5 THE CLERK: Mayor? 6 CHAIR CHIU: Bess Chiu, yes. 7 THE CLERK: Office of the Mayor? 8 MS. BERO: Julie Bero, yes. 9 THE CLERK: Comptroller? 10 MR. KATSORHIS: John Katsorhis, yes. 11 THE CLERK: Corporation Counsel? 12 MS. CANTOR: Sharon Cantor, yes. 13 THE CLERK: Office of Management and 14 Budget? 15 MS. QUINTIAN: Yvonne Quintian, yes. 16 THE CLERK: On behalf of the Borough 17 Presidents, President Borough of 18 Manhattan? 19 MS. MENDEZ: Rosie Mendez, yes. 20 THE CLERK: Calendar Item 1, 21 resolution is adopted. 22 CHAIR CHIU: Will the Clerk please call the second calendar item? 23 24 THE CLERK: New York City Department 25 of Information Technology and

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2	Telecommunications, Calendar Item No.2:
3	In the matter of the intent to seek
4	Franchise and Concession Review
5	Committee approval regarding a proposed
6	third amendment to a public

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1 installed on or before April 30, 2014, 2 (5) modification of CityBridge's minimum 3 investment 3 commitments, (6) 4 modification of requirements regarding 5 6 compensation payable by CityBridge to 7 the City, and (7) modification to advertising space available to the City 8 9 for its own use. 10 CHAIR CHIU: Is there a member who 11 wishes to make a statement or ask a 12 question on this matter? 13 MR. KATSORHIS: John Katsorhis from 14 the Comptroller's office. I'd like to 15 ask a question of DoITT, please. 16 CHAIR CHIU: Go ahead. MR. KATSORHIS: DoITT mentions in 17 18 its responsibility determining 19 documentation that "CityBridge is facing inability to make its required payments 2.0 and maintain its built out schedule due 21 22 to unanticipated financial challenges." While this third amendment is 23 24 intended to address some of the issues, 25 DoITT's responsibility in determination

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1 2 also mentions the plan of withdrawing from the consortium that makes up 3 CityBridge. In light of the departure 4 of this consortium, can DoITT please 5 6 confirm it still maintains its position 7 that CityBridge is a responsible franchisee? 8 9 MS. TISCH: Jessica Tisch. I do. 10 MR. KATSORHIS: Thank you. 11 I have no further questions or 12 statements. 13 CHAIR CHIU: Do any other members 14 wish to make a statement or ask a 15 question on this matter? 16 MR. CARACAPPA: This is Stephen Caracappa. I have a brief statement I'd 17 18 like to put on the record. 19 CHIEF CHIU: Go ahead. 20 MR. CARACAPPA: Thank you. 21 I'd like to thank my fellow FCRC 22 members for the time and opportunity. 23 With Staten Island set to the receive 24 the highest number of new Link 25 structures under this amendment, we want

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1 2 to express our opposition. We strongly oppose this initiative, 3 and in this issue, (inaudible), in order 4 to select a qualified amendment. 5 6 (Inaudible) expansion contract by reckless (inaudible) and then 7 threatening to take all current Links 8 9 offline, leaving the commission with 10 little choice but to vote in favor of 11 the amendment. 12 This sets poor precedent for the 13 city members and licensees, 14 fundamentally we all agree, and believe in the project. And that a public 15 16 private partnership is the best way to 17 get there. CityBridge is not that 18 partner, and we need a new RP. 19 Thank you. CHAIR CHIU: Is there any other 2.0 21 other members who wish to make a 22 statement or ask a question on this 23 matter? MS. CANTLO-COCKFIELD: Yes, this is 24 25 Tonya Cantlo from the Borough Brooklyn's

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1 office. I'd like to make a statement. 2 CHAIR CHIU: Sure. Please go ahead. 3 MS. CANTLO-COCKFIELD: So the 4 primary focus of this renegotiated deal, 5 6 we are closing the digital divide in New 7 York City. Expanding LinkNYC to a full 5G cellular technology is welcome, but 8 9 it must expand access to all New Yorkers 10 in all five boroughs. 11 Whether it is access to telehealth 12 services, online education resources, 13 job training, job searching, or 14 real-time information regarding public services, the digital divide has real 15 16 world consequences. According to the New York State Internet Master Plan, 18 17 18 percent of New York City residents do 19 not have an access to a home or mobile 2.0 internet connection. This proposal, in 21 coordination with the recently announced 22 \$157,000,000 capital investment in 23 providing access will help to bring more 24 people to the positive side of the 25 divide.

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The COVID-19 pandemic has shown how deeply this digital divide affects the daily lives of every New York City resident. The importance of access to broadband technology is only going to grow in the coming months and years. Access to technology should no longer be an area (inaudible), and expanding 5G service is critical to reach that goal. In the agreement there are sites in Community Boards 4, 9, 12, 16, totaling 147. We are requesting kiosks in Community Board 5, which is in East New York, and Community Board 8, which is in Canarsie. Thank you.

18 CHAIR CHIU: Are there any other members who wish to make a statement on 19 this matter? 2.0 21 MS. MENDEZ: Yes. This is Rosie 22 Mendez. I've had my hand raised, I 23 don't know if we're using that option. 24 MR. STAMOULIS: We have been trying 25 to correct that option.

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1 Please feel free to speak. 2 MS. MENDEZ: Thank you. We would 3 like (inaudible). The Bronx, Staten 4 Island, and Brooklyn Borough Presidents, 5 6 we recently raised the issue of how 7 these franchisees and this deal might affect other franchisees in the city, 8 and we certainly have been dealing with 9 10 the bus shelters here in Manhattan, and 11 we've been trying to with (inaudible) 12 trying to get the shelters in the outer 13 boroughs, and the other boroughs. 14 We have some concerns about how this might impact the public franchisees and 15 other agreements, and I know it's a 16 17 different agency, but the city really 18 needs to be looking at this as a whole. 19 We also hope that DoITT works with all of the boroughs, and that we 2.0 21 understand the digital divide, but 22 working with different borough 23 presidents and the other elected 24 officials to ensure that boroughs get 25 the amount of towers that they need in

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1 2 those boroughs. Thank you very much. 3 CHAIR CHIU: Are there any other 4 members who wish to make a statement or 5 6 ask a question on this matter? 7 MS. CAMILLE-SABIO: Yes, the Bronx Borough President's office wishes to 8 9 make a statement. 10 CHAIR CHIU: Go ahead. 11 MS. CAMILLE-SABIO: We echo the 12 concerns expressed by the representative 13 of the Brooklyn Borough President. 14 The Bronx Borough President commends and appreciates the hard work and effort 15 16 that is required in the transactions of 17 the renegotiations in this matter. Ιt is clear that amendment of the franchise 18 19 is trying to land each side in a better 2.0 position to ensure that every borough 21 inches closer to a place of more digital 22 access for all New Yorkers. 23 While this is laudable, on the other 24 hand, however, the Bronx seems to be 25 left behind, and expected to make due

1 with apparently less. While we're happy 2 to be in representation in three of our 3 immediate districts, the current total 4 of committed kiosks slated for the Bronx 5 6 is lower than we expected, and in fact, 7 lower than any other borough in the 8 city. 9 Bronx Borough President Diaz hopes 10 that going forward, it will be 11 purposeful, strategic, and also 12 inclusive of other areas in the Bronx, 13 so that many more Bronx sites are 14 afforded the benefit of greater digital access, and equity, and the delivery of 15 16 a (inaudible) pipeline that comes with 17 it. 18 Thank you. 19 CHAIR CHIU: Are there any other members who wish to make a statement or 2.0 21 ask a question on this matter? MR. SWISHER: This is Allan Swisher 22 23 from the Queens Borough President's 24 Office. It's not going to be redundant. 25 I think what my colleagues have stated,

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1 I share their concerns. But my office 2 is supportive of this amendment with 3 numerous benefits, because in the 4 digital divide in Queens, where many 5 6 communities have insufficient options 7 for reliable high speed internet access, that affects both residents and small 8 9 businesses. 10 So there's a lot to like in this 11 amendment. I did want to mention that 12 the real reason we're here today to vote 13 on this (inaudible) CityBridge failed to 14 live up to its obligations under its existing agreement. I also think the 15 16 message that they're sending to the 17 other franchise groups who are meeting 18 their obligations under their agreements 19 without any such breaks or concessions. Overall, I want to thank the Chair 2.0 21 for working to find a buyable path 22 forward on this matter, and I think 23 there's a lot to like, not in the event 24 that, with respect, an issue divides. 25 CHAIR CHIU: Are there any other

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1 2 members who wish to make a statement or 3 ask a question on this matter? 4 (No response was given.) CHAIR CHIU: Thank you for all of 5 6 your questions and your statements. 7 With that, will a member please make a motion to move this item? 8 9 MS. BERO: Julie Bero, so moved. 10 CHAIR CHIU: Will another member please second the motion? 11 12 UNNAMED MEMBER: So moved. 13 CHAIR CHIU: Will the clerk please 14 take the vote? 15 THE CLERK: Mayor? 16 CHAIR CHIU: Bess Chiu, yes. 17 THE CLERK: Office of the Mayor? 18 MS. BERO: Julie Bero, yes. 19 THE CLERK: Comptroller? 20 MR. KATSORHIS: John Katsorhis, yes. 21 THE CLERK: Corporation Counsel? 22 MS. BARTH: Amrita Barth, yes. 23 THE CLERK: Office of Management and 24 Budget? 25 MS. QUINTIAN: Yes.

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1 2 THE CLERK: On behalf of the Borough 3 Presidents. President Borough of Oueens? 4 5 MR. SWISHER: Allan Swisher, yes, but I would like the record to reflect 6 7 that the Staten Island Borough President is not in support. 8 9 THE CLERK: Calendar Item 2, 10 resolution is adopted. 11 We ask that the reporter make the 12 entire Public Meeting Agenda, which was 13 made publicly available and distributed 14 at this meeting, part of the final 15 record of this proceeding.
