

M/WBE Small Purchase Award Method Audit Review
July 1, 2025, through September 30, 2025

For the period between July 1, 2025, and September 30, 2025, City agencies have utilized the M/WBE Small Purchase Award Method (SP) on 295 occasions, resulting in contract actions for 168 unique M/WBE vendors.

The awardees during the relevant period show M/WBE award categories disaggregated as follows:

In addition to the above performance metrics, MOCS audited and analyzed 10% of all contract actions registered during Q1 of FY'26 that were not procured using the M/WBE Small Purchase method. Upon reviewing and corresponding with the agencies, 79 contracts out of the 128-sample audit were identified as revenue contracts, while 17 contracts were within the Human Service industry. Furthermore, the audit did not reveal any instances in which there is evidence that the agency did not utilize the M/WBE SP method where it was appropriate.
