

M/WBE Small Purchase Award Method Audit Review  
October 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025

For the period between October 1, 2025, and December 31, 2025, City agencies have utilized the M/WBE Small Purchase Award Method (SP) on 271 occasions, resulting in contract actions for 154 unique M/WBE vendors.

The awardees during the relevant period show M/WBE award categories disaggregated as follows:

**Male-Owned Asian**

In addition to the above performance metrics, MOCS audited and analyzed 10% of all contract actions registered during Q2 of FY'26 that were not procured using the M/WBE Small Purchase method. Upon reviewing and corresponding with the agencies, 90 contracts out of the 110-sample audit were within the Human Service industry, while 12 contracts were either subscriptions or within the Micro purchase limit. Furthermore, the audit did not reveal any instances in which there is evidence that the agency did not utilize the M/WBE SP method where it was appropriate.
