

## Accessible Entrance Signage

The NYC Building Code requires signage at all buildings that have both accessible and inaccessible entrances indicating a building's nearest accessible entrance.

### Signage Types:

1. **International Symbol of Accessibility** (NYC updated symbol, summer 2013) with text in English/Spanish with corresponding Braille strip below



Example (ACCESSIBLE ENTRANCE)

2. **Directional Signage** with the International symbol of accessibility, large directional arrow facing the same way, and text in English/Spanish with corresponding Braille strip below



Example (INACCESSIBLE ENTRANCE)

Inaccessible entrances where an accessible entrance exists

**Note:** Accessible signage requirements are enforced by the NYC Department of Buildings. You may be issued a violation and subject to a fine if accessible signage is not provided.
