## CoC Overview

- CoC's are regional or local planning bodies that manage HUD-funded housing and services for people experiencing homelessness
- Key CoC roles
  - Coordinating and preparing the annual HUD funding application
  - Promoting a more structured and strategic approach to housing and services for people experiencing homelessness
  - Improving service coordination and efficiency
  - Providing technical assistance and support for funded projects
- NYC CoC
  - CoC lead agency: Dept. of Social Services
  - Appr. \$150 million in annual funding across 165+ projects

## CoC NOFO Overview

---

- NOFO=Notice of Funding Opportunity (f/k/a NOFA)
- Competitive annual funding opportunity for CoC's nationwide
  - Allows CoC's to apply for both renewal and new project funding
  - NYC CoC submits "collaborative application" on behalf of the entire community
- 2023 expected NOFO release date: late June
- HUD requires each CoC to coordinate their own local competition, with fair and impartial review and ranking
- NYC CoC history: Modest growth through each year's NOFO

## Local Competition Overview

---

- Only relevant to new projects—not renewals
- CoC website and email list for all updates and materials
- Earlier local competition timeline
- Important dates
  - Early submission deadline: May 1 (ensures opportunity for technical assistance)
  - Late submission deadline: May 15
  - Applicants notified of conditional acceptance or rejection: June 1
- Applications reviewed by CoC team as well as new project review committee
- Conditionally accepted projects will enter information into online portal (with CoC support) following official NOFO release

## Eligible Project Types and Local Priorities

---

- Project types
  - New Rapid Re-housing (RRH)
  - New Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)
  - Expansion of existing RRH and PSH
    - Can include increase in units and/or expansion of services through new staff roles
- Local priorities (may receive special consideration in scoring)
  - PSH: bolstering existing services, serving medically frail and older adults, leveraging other funding
  - RRH: families w/ children, formerly in foster care, justice involvement, leveraging other funding
