2026 CoC Program NOFO

e-snaps Guidance - *e-snaps is not open yet*

Renewing PSH, TH, SSO, HMIS projects - will submit renewal applications in e-snaps. Submission in e-snaps does not guarantee inclusion in the competition. Projects may be rejected and fully reallocated, or may be reduced and partially reallocated.

All New Projects - will submit applications in e-snaps. This includes RRH and TH-RRH projects that propose a transition to SSO or TH. Submission in e-snaps does not guarantee inclusion in the competition.

All renewing RRH projects - will be considered for renewal, and if selected, will be invited to apply in e-snaps. *(In the case that a selected RRH project also submitted a New Project application in e-snaps, the grantee will be able to withdraw the transition application and submit an RRH renewal in e-snaps.)* [2026 e-snaps Guidance \(pdf\)](#)

CSH Moving On Program

CSH and the NYC Department of Housing Preservation & Development (HPD) relaunches the Moving On program.

Moving On connects eligible supportive housing residents with affordable, independent housing opportunities while creating space for new households currently in shelter.

CSH and HPD are seeking supportive housing providers to partner with in identifying tenants ready to move on and helping them access vouchers and housing navigation support. Participating providers will receive capacity building grants to support their Moving On work over a two-year period.

City To Expand Housing Vouchers in Budget

Last month the city reached a deal to expand city-subsidized rental assistance as part of a larger budget agreement, which will be administered under a new program by HPD. The \$175 million voucher expansion broadens the eligibility for city-subsidized rental assistance include some people living in rent stabilized housing and a larger subset of people living in homeless shelters.

Housing Works is Growing!

With two developments under construction, the Liro and Pitkin Residences are set to be completed this Fall, adding 151 units to Housing Works' portfolio.

[The Liro](#), named after the oldest living tree in New York City, will include 112 units of affordable housing, 30,000 sq ft of MTA office space, and 9,000 sq ft of neighborhood retail. This project converts an unused MTA parking lot into supportive and affordable housing that respects the neighborhood's history. The Liro will provide 67 units of supportive housing for formerly homeless individuals, of which 59 units will be targeted for long term survivors of HIV/AIDS. The Liro will be located on 806 Ninth Avenue in Hell's Kitchen, a neighborhood with the city's highest concentration of residents living with HIV and one of the highest rates of new infections,

[The Pitkin Residence](#) is Housing Works' first stand-alone LIHTC development and was made possible through the strategic acquisition and merger of adjacent development sites. Pitkin Residence is a 39-unit affordable and supportive housing development in East New York with 22 supportive studio apartments for individuals with lived experience of homelessness. With Pitkin, Housing Works aimed to build housing adjacent to its existing network of care to improve health outcomes and expand its development experience.
