HUD to Ensure Equal Opportunity in the Appraisal Profession

HUD reached a Conciliation Agreement with The Appraisal Foundation (TAF). The agreement seeks to address complaint against TAF alleging

discriminatory barriers preventing qualified Black people and other persons of color from entering the appraisal profession on the basis of race in violation of the Fair Housing Act. <u>Read the</u> <u>Conciliation Agreement here</u>.

HUD awards \$26 million to HIV Epidemic

HUD awarded \$26 million to Housing Interventions (HINT) to End the HIV Epidemic program, which will go to 11 communities throughout the country. This one-time award will fund housing assistance and supportive services for eligible individuals and families, coordination and planning activities, grants management and administration.
