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## **Innovative Urban Village Opens**

[Last year Urban Resource Institute \(URI\) broke ground on their innovative Urban Village.](#) Innovative Urban Village brings approximately 2,000 affordable homes and community resources to East New York, Brooklyn. The development was a collaboration between Reverend A.R. Bernard and the Christian Cultural Center (CCC), Gotham Organization and Monadnock Development. The Village also sets aside 94 apartments for survivors of domestic violence, who will be supported on-site by URI's trauma-informed care teams. **The application is open until June 30th.**

### **Federal housing cuts could leave 7K formerly homeless New Yorkers at risk**

With HUD signaling a shift in funding toward the Continuum of Care program to reflect its new priorities, housing advocates are concerned that this could upend the "housing first" model, which relies on Continuum of Care grants. Through the CoC grants, New York City receives \$165 million, which helps to house over 7,000 formerly homeless New Yorkers.

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## **The City Releases “SPEED” Reforms to Speed up Affordable Housing Development**

Last month, the City released the Streamlining Procedures to Expedite Equitable Development (“SPEED”) report, which brings a host of reforms to deliver affordable housing faster across New York City. Referrals which aim to cut timelines for all affordable housing projects by eight months, including reducing the timeline by two years for projects that require zoning change.
