NYC and National Coalition of Local Jurisdictions Bring Suit Against Federal Government
Conditions Imposed After NYC Was Awarded More Than \$53.5 Million in Funds for Coming Year to Provide Rental Assistance for Chronically Homeless Households to Reside in Permanent Supportive Housing
Loss of Continuum of Care Funding Would Threaten Housing Stability of More Than 2,700 NYC Households Relying on Permanent Supportive Housing and Put Potentially Thousands More at Risk of Losing Their Permanent Housing

NYC Joins Litigation



Overview:

- In March, NYC Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) received three CoC grant agreements for renewal that included new conditions for funding.
- These new conditions have little to no bearing on the rental assistance to homeless households the funds support and are very different from the sorts of conditions that had been included in HUD CoC grant agreements in the past.
- New York City joined a coalition of cities and counties led by King County, Washington in a lawsuit challenging these improper conditions.

NYC Joins Litigation



Timeline:

- **May 2nd** – NYC announced it was joining litigation
 - Press release issued
- **May 7th** – Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) Hearing in King County, et al. v. Turner, et al.
 - TRO granted
- **May 21th** – Preliminary Injunction (PI) Hearing in King County et al. v. Turner et al.
 - Judge ruled from bench that she will grant the PI
- **May 23rd** – Order granting updated/second TRO
 - To be in place until PI is ordered

What's Next:

- Awaiting PI order
- Additional localities/jurisdictions joining litigation

Renewal Season



What is the Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW)?

- The GIW is used to record all grants within a CoC's geographic area that are eligible for renewal funding in the upcoming CoC Program Competition. The GIW calculates an Annual Renewal Amount (ARA) for each project, which is the sum of each project's renewable budget line items.

What is a renewal?

- An existing project within a CoC applying to renew its contract with HUD for another grant term.

What is e-snaps?

- *e-snaps* is the electronic CoC Program Application and Grants Management System that HUD's Office of Special Needs Assistance Programs (SNAPS) uses to support the CoC Program funding application and grant awards process for the CoC Program.

Timeline (estimate)

- **June 2025** - Grant Inventory Worksheet
- **July 2025** - Renewal Submission in e-snaps
- **August 2025** - NYC Continuum of Care Review
- **August 29th 2025** - NYC Continuum of Care Submits Renewals to HUD

Renewal Season



June

- Ensure your Unique Entity ID (UEI) is up to date in SAMS.gov
- Review your current grant details and communicate any concerns to your project monitoring liaison right away
- Confirm your agency GIW reviewer and approver
- Identify your agency e-snaps users and ensure access to the system
- Identify a backup for both your GIW approver and e-snaps contact
- Confirm your project listing on the GIW and submit necessary change forms (when available)
 - Changes over 10% of a budget lines item (BLI) require a grant amendment

July

- Agency e-snaps users attend an e-snaps training/refresher
- Submit all your agency's projects in e-snaps and communicate issues right away
- The NYC CoC begins its review of all e-snaps submissions

August

- The NYC CoC continues its review of all e-snaps submissions
- All amended e-snaps submissions are due back in e-snaps
- **August 29th** - NYC CoC submits all renewals to HUD

How to Get Ready!



- 1. Ensure your Unique Entity ID (UEI) is up to date in SAM.gov**
- 2. Review your current grant details and prepare for GIW confirmation**
- 3. Identify your agency e-snaps users and ensure access to the system**
- 4. Communicate any concerns about your renewal right away!**
 - The sooner we know there is an issue the better we can work with you to find a solution
- 5. Confirm your project listing on the GIW and submit necessary change forms (when available)**
 - Changes over 10% of a budget lines item (BLI) require a grant amendment
