

















Background

- All jurisdictions receiving HUD Continuum of Care funding are required to complete a HIC/PIT report.
- The HIC and PIT must take place on a single night during the last 10 days in January
 - For 2024, the date of the HIC PIT was Tuesday, January 23 to correspond with the unsheltered Homeless Outreach Population Estimate (HOPE).
- NYC's HIC PIT is managed by the Department of Social Services Office of Research and Policy Innovation.




