

Provider Spotlight: Special NOFO Series

In the fifth installment of our ongoing Provider Spotlight: Special NOFO Series, this month the CoC would like to spotlight **Jericho Project** who was recently awarded funding from HUD's [Special NOFO](#) for their project **Jericho Unsheltered Rapid Rehousing Program**.

For over four decades, Jericho Project has provided housing and life-changing services to homeless and at-risk individuals and families in New York City. From their genesis in 1983, when three Episcopal churches answered the call to help address New York City's burgeoning homeless crisis, to today, when nearly 90,000 adults and children sleep in New York City homeless shelters every night, Jericho Project has stayed true to its mission to help end homelessness at its roots. Housing First Intervention Outcomes

Research done by the Urban Institute and other experts underscore why Housing First interventions are still the best way to help people exit homelessness. The findings suggest that despite misconceptions and criticism, Housing First is still the best and most successful strategy to help people exit homelessness.

New Federal Funding Increases Capacity & Innovation for Unsheltered Homelessness


In 2023, The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced \$420 million in awards to address unsheltered homelessness in 32 communities. A [new report](#) from the Alliance's Homelessness Research Institute examines how communities will use these funds to expand their unsheltered homelessness response, highlighting key trends in how localities used HUD's supplemental funding and outlines the benefits that they expect from these investments.



New Initiative Allows Medicaid to Help Pay for Rent

HHS and HUD announces that eight states and the District of Columbia (DC) have been selected to participate in a new federal initiative, "Housing and Services Partnership Accelerator" (Accelerator). The Accelerator will help strengthen partnerships across housing, disability, aging, and health sectors, unlocking critical resources to reduce homelessness by addressing health-related social needs. Allowing participating states and D.C. the ability to use Medicaid funds to help pay for things like rent, utility subsidies, and food.
